FACILITY ISSUES

There have been some issues reported about how the facility is being looked after by patrons. On several occasions the following has been reported:

- Club cage locks have been removed and thrown in bins or down the toilets.
- Toilets have been blocked with various items causing plumbing alarms: one toilet was clogged with clothing, one toilet with a roll of duct tape, and another with a 3/4 full toilet roll in it.



- Heaters in the changerooms had been turned on at 31 degrees and left on
- Taps had been turned on and left running.
- A full hand wash dispenser had been tipped out into a sink, resulting in bubbles coming up through a drain.

The cost of running water, gas water heating, reverse cycle heating, the plumber call out plus the challenge of trying find the missing club locks may cost HCV (and therefore our clubs) added costs to running our facility.

It is suspected that these activities have been undertaken by children that are bored and seeking ways to keep themselves busy. If you are a parent that is playing or training and your kids are left to their own devices, please have them stay out of the changerooms/club cages area. They are more than welcome to use the Foxtel on the big TV in the social space.

Also, alarmingly two live rounds of .22 calibre hollow point bullets were discovered on the West Pitch viewing platform. These were disarmed and discarded. The discovery was reported to the police and they have investigated. Whilst no one was harmed, the discovery is quite concerning!

I ask that we all be vigilant in caring for our facility. If you see something or someone doing something that isn't right, please raise it.

CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

All organisations in Victoria that provide services or facilities for children are required to comply with Child Safe Standards, to ensure that the safety of children is promoted, child abuse is prevented, and allegations of child abuse are properly responded to.

The <u>Child Safe Standards</u> are minimum compulsory standards for all organisations that interact with children and young people. The Standards aim to prevent abuse through a focus on cultural change and help to protect children from the risks of abuse.

New Child Safe Standards are coming to better protect children and young people from abuse. The new Standards will **commence on 1 July 2022**. The eleven new Standards will replace Victoria's current seven standards and principles.

Key changes include new requirements:

- To involve families and communities in organisations' efforts to keep children and young people safe
- For a greater focus on safety for Aboriginal children and young people
- To manage the risk of child abuse in online environments
- For greater clarity on the governance, systems and processes to keep children and young people safe.

Changes have been made to support greater national consistency, reflecting the National Principles for a Child Safe Organisation developed following the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

An overview of the new Standards is provided below:

- 1. Organisations establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued
- 2. Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture
- 3. Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously
- 4. Families and communities are informed, and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing
- 5. Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice
- 6. People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice
- 7. Processes for complaints and concerns are child focused
- 8. Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training
- 9. Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed
- 10. Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved
- 11. Policies and procedures document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.
