

PRE-SEASON ROUND-ROBIN STYLE TOURNAMENT IN BENDIGO – 18-19 FEBRUARY 2023

Hockey Central Victoria is hosting a pre-season weekend tournament on February 18/19. This is an opportunity for Clubs from across the state to come together here in Bendigo and play some great pre-season hockey. There will also be a casual social function held on the Saturday night!

The games format will be 11-a-side full field. Timing will be 15 minute halves, with a 5 minute halftime break and 10 minutes between games (no stoppages).

Senjuns are looking into entering the following teams:

- 1. Under 14 mixed
- 2. Under 18 mixed
- 3. Open Men's
- 4. Open Women's

There will be a small entry fee per team, this will be finalised when the number of teams is known within each category. It will only be to cover costs of hosting the event and will be kept as minimal as possible.

Once team entries have been received, more information will come out regarding game times.

We need to know whether you wish to play. I need to know this information prior to 25 January. Please email the club! If we do not have enough for a full 11-a-side team, HCV will help facilitate a combined team with another Club.

<u>President – Rob Murdoch</u>

The role of President is to be figurehead for the Club and assist with publicity and growth of Bendigo Senjuns Hockey Club (the Club). This includes representation on external Hockey Central Victoria committees, participation and chairing of Bendigo Senjuns Committee meetings and liaising with other Clubs in the Hockey Central Victoria (HCV) competition.



Vice President - Kerri Boyd

The role of the Vice President is to shadow and support the President in providing leadership to the Club.



<u>Treasurer – Mark Albrecht</u>

The role of the Treasurer is to oversee the financial position of the Club including invoicing members, purchase of Club equipment or receipt of sponsorship funds. The Treasurer is responsible for regularly reporting the Club's financial position to the Committee.



Secretary – Kelly Harris (aka Harry)

The role of the Secretary is to facilitate information sharing between the Committee and the broader Club membership. This includes monitoring the Club correspondence, responding to requests for information from Club members and members of the public and being the primary point of contact for the Club.

GRASSPORTS JUNIOR COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Dates: Saturday 20th & Sunday 21st May, 2023

Locations: Essendon Hockey Centre (Under 13 Boys & Girls), Greensborough Hockey Centre (Under 15 Boys & Girls), Melbourne Sports Centres Parkville (Under 18 Boys & Girls).

Team entry information for this Event will be released early in 2023.

From 2024, the age groups of this Event will change to align with the JSC, HA Nationals and HV Winter Competition age groups (Under 14, Under 16 and Under 18). But for 2023, the age groups will remain as Under 13, Under 15 and Under 18.

GRASSPORTS SENIOR COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS & MASTERS STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Dates: Saturday 10th to Monday 12th June, 2023

Locations: Hawthorn Malvern Hockey Centre (Women) & Footscray Hockey Centre (Men)

GRASSPORTS JUNIOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

There will be some significant changes taking place in 2023. Hockey Australia have recently announced that the age groups for their National Championships will change in 2024 (please click here to view that article). But Hockey Victoria will adjust the JSC age groups from 2023. This will mean from 2023, the JSC age groups will align with the HV Winter Competition age groups, then from 2024, there will also be alignment with the HA Nationals age groups.

Further to that, in 2023 the Under 18 Nationals will be delivered at a different time of the year and they now directly clash with the Hockey Victoria Grassports Junior State Championships. As such the following changes have also been made:

Under 14 and Under 16 Grassports Junior State Championships – Thursday 29th June to Sunday 2nd July, 2023 at Melbourne Sports Centres Parkville and Footscray Hockey Centre

Under 18 Grassports Junior State Championships – EITHER of Friday 22nd September to Sunday 24th September OR Wednesday 27th September to Friday 29th September at Melbourne Sports Centres Parkville. Some further important points are:

HV is working with the Hockey One League to try to host a Hockey Club Melbourne Men's & Women's match to coincide with the Under 18 JSC in September. We hope to have both that and the Under 18 JSC dates confirmed before the end of this year.

It is worth noting that there may be some Under 16 athletes that are selected in the Victorian Under 18 State or Development Teams. This would mean those athletes would not be able to participate in the Under 16 JSC as it would clash with the Under 18 Nationals. Those athletes will be permitted to trial for their Under 18 JSC Zone team should they wish to.

In addition to the above changes, HV are thrilled to also be offering and Under 12 Hockey 5's Junior State Championships. This will be a wonderful introduction to the JSC for Under 12s. It will run for 2 days across Saturday 1st and Sunday 2nd July and will take place at Melbourne Sports Centres Parkville or Footscray to coincide with the Under 14 and Under 16 JSC.

TRIALLING FOR UNDER 15 STATE TEAM

Players wishing to trial for the Under 15 state team will need to be a member of the Hockey Victoria Academy or nominate and attend the Open Player Assessment Day where you will be assessed and invited to attend the trials. U15 Nationals will be held in Darwin 15-21 April.

FAIR PLAY CODE

The Victorian Government recently relaunched 2022 <u>Fair Play Code</u>, an update of the 2018 blueprint that sets out the standards of behaviour expected of everyone involved in sport and active recreation.

At the heart of the Fair Play Code (FPC) are five principles of Integrity, Respect, Responsibility, Safety and Fairness. These principles apply to everyone involved in sport in Victoria, no matter what role they play. Bad behaviour, violence, cheating and intimidation has no place in sport and active recreation in our state.

Senjuns have been provided with promotional materials that we will be using this season.

Our club is a fair play club

We expect the following standards of behaviour from every person involved in our club including players, spectators, parents, coaches, administrators.



Integrity

- Be honest, fair, reliable and transparent
- · Avoid conflicts of interest
- · Strive to earn and maintain community trust
- Don't engage in, or advocate possession or use of banned performance enhancing or illicit drugs
- Don't participate in, or encourage match-fixing, illegal sports betting or other corruption.



Respect

- Treat everyone in a considerate, objective and courteous manner
- Refrain from any form of discrimination, harassment, bullying, abuse, intimidation, victimisation or vilification of others.
- Recognise and value the contribution of all.



Responsibility

- Accept the consequences of your actions
- · Be a positive role model
- Comply with Victorian Child Safe Standards (2022)
- Understand the consequences of breaching the Code.
- · Report and manage breaches.



Fairness

- · Play by the rules and in the spirit of the game
- Be informed, consistent, impartial and reasonable
- · Be a 'good sport'
- Provide a 'fair go' to people of all abilities.



Safety

- Provide a safe, welcoming and inclusive environment
- Ensure equipment, facilities and programs meet the required standards
- Support club policies E.g. child safeguarding and member protection
- Show concern and caution for others. Immediately report issues.

SPORTS FOCUS - MAKE SPORT SAFER FOR WOMEN & GIRLS



The project: understanding our sporting communities so Sport Focus can work with clubs to develop supports in preventing and responding to gender abuse.

Sports Focus are doing a research project that our members have the option to take part in. The research is being conducted by Sports Focus, Leisure Networks and La Trobe University.
