I started rowing in my last 2 years at school and joined Mercantile Rowing Club towards the end of year 12 (then called HSC!). I had a successful time in Mercantile and Victorian crews, and progressed to the national U23 squad & an AIS scholarship (so was based in Canberra). More success followed however by the late 80's I'd realised there was more to getting selected for national boats than just winning races & big ergo scores.

I stepped away from rowing and progressed in other sports including Sailing, Karate, XC skiing and Road & TT racing (cycling). I also started coaching, initially with junior hockey teams and then road cyclists and rowers. The rowing coaching roles included travelling to & coaching a men' sweep & sculling squad in Malang, East Java, and 2 seasons at MLC in Perth WA.

My return to rowing & masters racing was unplanned despite which I lined up at the 2019 WA State titles & the 2019 AMRC in UWA & composite crews.

That led to my involvement with the BMRC mens' squad, to whom I'm very grateful especially during this recent lockdown.

I'm looking forward to making BMRC boats to go fast and assisting other BMRC members to do the same.
