


CLUB Update August 2021

Congratulations to Luke Letcher and the Australian Men's Quad Scull for winning a Bronze Medal at the Tokyo Olympics.

Rowing Australia reported:

Jack Cleary, Caleb Antill, Cameron Girdlestone and Luke Letcher had tough competition, facing the Netherlands, Great Britain, Italy, Poland and Estonia.

But a hard-fought race saw the Australian crew fight back in the second half of the course and take the bronze behind the Dutch and British Crews with a time of 5:33.97.

"Having no international competition coming in, we only had each other to race against so the Men's Four is our key competitor at home and we knew we were up there with those guys so to come away with bronze is awesome." Antill said.

"We haven't raced these guys in two years." Girdlestone added. "We came here to shock the world, as the Australian Rowing team and we've done that."

At the 1500 meter mark the Australians were in fourth place. The Australian reported:......with 250 metres to go they had lifted their stroke rate to 42 – easily the highest of the final.

Stroke Luke Letcher took a cheeky peek across to the left but Netherlands held on to win in 5min32.03 secs with Great Britain next and Australia 1.94 seconds behind.

But for Australia's Jack Cleary, Caleb Antill, Cameron Girdlestone and Letcher it was a race within a race.

Luke is a current BMRC member, is a product of the Radford rowing program under Philip Winkworth and was coached by David Bagnall. I can remember watching Luke win an Australian Championship in the schoolboys' coxed quad in Adelaide in 2011. Luke has gone on from strength to strength, and is well supported by his parents – BMRC member Vicky Newman, and avid Rowing ACT photographer Graham Letcher. Congratulations to you all!

Main points from the Committee meeting August

- Rechargeable lights have arrived for Club members' use. Directions for their use, and recharging directions will be available soon.
- The Murray River Rowathon has been cancelled due to Covid concerns.
- A defibrillator is being ordered for the Club. It will be positioned in the boat storage area for maximum accessibility.
- The two new boats on order (A quad/four and a double/pair) are expected to arrive in October.
- In order to improve safety when rowing in the dark the Committee has decided all Club boats will have a **flashing light on the bow**, **and a fixed light on the stern**. Club boats have a washer attached to the stern canvas so lights can be attached via magnets. The Club has a few **stern** lights for sale for \$10 and we will be ordering more. Watch for a separate email with a link to purchase these.

See Captain's advice later in this Newsletter re the Club's **new** rechargeable bow lights available for members' use.

- 2 safety reminders for members:
 - If you cannot see the bank of Weston Creek because of fog, it is not safe to venture onto the water.
 - The pontoons can be VERY slippery due to black ice on these very cold mornings. Take extra care.
- The AGM is pencilled in for Saturday 18th September. Committee candidates are asked to write a short blurb to introduce themselves to other members.
- The Committee is gathering information together to create an Honour Board – so our high achievers are not forgotten as the years go by.
 Categories are yet to be decided but might include Founding Members, Life Members, Australian representatives.

As reported earlier, the Committee has agreed to require Club boats to be fitted with **two** lights when rowing in the dark – a fixed light on the stern canvas, and a flashing light on the bow. A number of rechargeable lights have been purchased for members to use, with the priority being Club boats. The lights are stored in a recharging case when not in use.

While their operation and charging is reasonably intuitive, we will soon have some instructions on how to use the lights

We will shortly be wiping the boat booking board for the new competition season. Please keep your eyes out for emails that will explain the process where you can ask to have a current booking retained.
