2010 BRSC Junior Training & Boat Rules

- Training starts at 10am sharp for briefing. Finish 12 noon.
- Boats will be allocated at briefing. Boats will be shared according to sailors present. If you are not there you will miss out.
- Boats must be packed up by 12 noon.
- Juniors must wait for the instructor and rescue boat being ready before going sailing and must return to shore when instructed.

Junior sailors must have parental / responsible adult help and supervision to rig, launch, retrieve, and unrig.

- ~Only hoist the sails immediately prior to launching.
- ~After launching, place the trolley up on the grass.
- ~When sailing back to the beach, parents help to catch the boat. No part of the boat ever touches the sand. Hold afloat if changing sailors, otherwise the boat must be put on the trolley.
- ~The sail must be dropped.
- ~At the end of the session the boat must be de-rigged, washed and sponged out. The dry sail rolled up and placed in its bag. The boat returned to storage.
- ~Sailor/s are responsible for the boat they have been allocated on that day.

The club has invested in new training boats (FireBugs) and maintains the club Lasers & Pacers for the benefit of members. Club boats give members the opportunity to learn to sail before purchase of their own boat.

Currently there is no charge for sailing members to use these boats. If the boats are not properly looked after, as above, a sailor may be disallowed the use of club boats.

Club PFD's are available with \$2 deposit, returned when washed and hung up after sailing. BRSC recommends you purchase a correctly fitting PFD jacket for your child.

2010 Junior Training will have a lesson structure.

Juniors will be permitted to race when they have achieved YA Basic Skills and Rules.

Look after the boats and enjoy learning to sail!
