CREE SHIELD v ROCKHAMPTON

Bundaberg got within one match of regaining the Cree Shield when Rockhampton visited on November 19. As is usual, Rocky dominated on the top three tables, winning each match very comfortably. Our fourth team of Kane Chantarat, Susan McDonald and Lorraine Fourro snatched a last gasp 6-5 win, Kane winning his three singles, Susan two singles including an incredible display of her power in the final singles against Erica Nolan, and Lorraine one singles. Our fifth team unfortunately could not convert a 5-4 lead into the win which would have clinched the Shield for us. Ironically, Emily Steffen won the last singles for Rocky this time after she lost the deciding final match to Deleece McDonald in 2020 when we last won the Shield. Travis McDermid led the sixth team to a 6-5 victory with four wins overall, coming back from 5/10 in the fifth game of the last singles for another amazing result. Our seventh team were much too strong for their opponents, winning 10-1.

Conducted over Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning, the camp enabled Matthew and Kelsey to work with some established juniors as well as meeting a number of new players. The camp finished with a competition for the 2023 Hopes players (12 years and younger) to qualify for the Queensland Hopes camp in Brisbane at the end the school holidays in January.

QUEENSLAND SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS – STATE FINALS

Bundaberg schools had plenty of success at the State Finals in Brisbane on Friday 2 December. Three teams won their competition, three more were runners-up and two others came third. The remaining two teams came fourth, narrowly missing out on winning medals.

In the Open Boys, Bundaberg Christian College made it back-to-back wins after also claiming gold last year. Braydon Chapman and Matthew Udal again had the narrowest of wins over the Bundaberg State High team of Kane Chantarat and Kye Meuli in a repeat of their match at the Bundaberg qualifying tournament in early November. In a match of the highest quality and close results, Braydon edged out Kane in the final game of the last singles for a 3-2 victory to decide the overall winner of the competition.
