PEARLS FROM PETE

Hi again, just a short update on club activities since our last newsletter. Winter season fixtures are now underway, good luck to all those participating. Unfortunately, I am not playing this season due to getting new knees sometime very soon, but I will be back playing again as soon as I get the clearance from my medical team.

We applied for a grant recently to fund a defibrillator, and upgrade our first aid kit, however we were unsuccessful with that grant. At our committee meeting on Monday 10th of May, the committee voted

to purchase one despite not getting the grant, and Rashed Aziz has been tasked to research and recommend which one for us to buy. Standby for an announcement once we have purchased that defibrillator. Our thanks go to our Patron, Pauline Langford, who has very generously offered to donate a sizeable proportion of the cost.

We have also applied for a grant through the Gambling Fund for 6 solar powered whirly birds. If we are successful with that grant, Andrew McCurley will be installing them for us at some point in the future. We don't expect a decision on that grant for a couple of months.

We have also ordered a new modem to replace our old one, which was bundled with our landline phone and costing us more money than what it was worth. Our new plan will be for a 5G broadband mobile router and no landline phone. You can expect the landline at the club to be disconnected by around the 20th of May. Once the new 5G router is installed, there will be a new WiFi network and password. Those who require access to the WiFi will be given the details as required. I conducted a speed test of internet download in the canteen before ordering the new 5G router, and the speed test results showed downloads around 40 times faster than our current internet (from 6mbps up to 240mbps).

This faster, better internet will give us the option to livestream major events with much more fidelity. I am

researching ways to set that capability up by utilising the club's existing Panasonic HD video camera. It should be possible to not only livestream, but have the ability to overlay text and graphics, for example player names, scores and the club logo. My research shows the Youtube Live offers more functionality than Facebook Live, but if anyone is an expert in this area or can provide valuable advice please feel free to contact me.

That's about it for now, good luck with fixtures and I will keep serving while you receive!

WINTER & TERM 2 JUNIOR SEASONS

The Term 2 Junior season eventually got underway last Friday after a number of players had been unavailable for the first two weeks of the term. There has been a slight increase in the number of players but pleasingly several new ones which is great to see.

The **Winter season** began this week with one extra team in the Tuesday night Division 3 competition but unfortunately a drop in numbers on Wednesday nights with quite a few players unavailable due to school, work, injury and health reasons. However, with all divisions having six teams there are no byes so overall about the same number of players will be involved each week compared to last season. Thankfully, there are a reasonable number of players who have made themselves as reserves but it will be important that team members make themselves available as much as possible as suitable reserves will not always be able to take their places, especially at short notice.

Wednesday night players PLEASE NOTE that there will be three rounds played on Monday nights – June 7 and July 12 (due to clashes with State of Origin matches) and July 19 (due to many players going to the Queensland Veterans Championships that start on Thursday 22 July). Please make a note and let me know if you are unavailable for any of those nights in particular.

SCHOOLS TABLE TENNIS

The postponed finals of the Bundaberg Secondary Schools Summer Table Tennis season were played on April 28 and, as expected, both divisions were won by the powerful Bundaberg Christian College teams. In Division One, Andrew and Matthew Udal, Braydon Chapman and Natasha Jefferson, were too strong for all opposition and defeated Shalom College 6-0. In Division Two, former club members Ari Maatta and Daniel Basson, along with Noah Elson, had to play well to overcome a determined Kepnock team 5-3.

The Term 2 Year 5 & 6 Friday Inter-school competition began on April 30 with 28 teams (112 players) from six schools competing over a five week

season. Given these numbers, fourteen tables have to be set up so any assistance with doing this on Thursdays and / or removing the extra tables after the competition finishes about 2.15 on Fridays will be greatly appreciated.
