As the end of 2018 draws to a close everyone at CCHA should be proud as this season has seen many fantastic results, both on field and off field.

- A huge thank you to all the clubs that participated in the documenting of the new Assoc Bylaws. This took many hours of discussion to finalise the new document for 2018. Whilst there were a few gaps in some rules I think most agreed that the new rules provided for a much fairer competition and supported the Assoc plans for growth of our Junior members into the Senior Comp.
- ➤ Gosford Hockey Club were again the major winners in the Hunter Coast Mens PHL, and The Avoca Devils nearly gave us the Premier League double but unfortunately went down in a penalty shootout in the Hunter Coast Womens PHL.
- Massive congratulations to Lain Carr on his selection in the Australian Youth Olympics team. This is a well deserved recognition for one of our finest Junior players. I look forward to following his progress in the green and gold for many years to come.
- Our Canteen and liquor licence continues to be well supported and provides much added revenue for our Assoc.
- ➤ Hosted the U13 & U15 Hunter Indoor cup & the 2018 U15 Boys/Girls HNSW Indoor State Championships

All of these items take a lot of organisation and support so I would like to thank the many volunteers that have helped out at any time throughout the season. Without your efforts and dedicated none of this happens.

2018 saw us start a new partnership with Wyong Golf Club culminating in them hosting the 2018 Junior Rep presentation. Feedback from all those that attended was that it was a fantastic event despite being squeezed into the venue. We now currently hold the record for the biggest function held at the club. We look forward to many years of mutual support from the club so it's great to have them back on board

I would also like to thank our Major sponsors; Optimum Health & Performance, Bendigo Bank Wyong & Elite Hockey. We look forward to continued support into the next season

As like past seasons, there are still challenges that arise and need to be dealt with and this season has been no different. Other challenges to be addressed into 2018:

Sand field replacement – This continues to be the main focus for the Board. We are now the #1 regional priority for Hockey NSW in their discussions with the Minister for Sport. We are currently awaiting the outcome of our final submission to the Regional Sporting Infrastructure fund so



hopefully it will soon be our turn to have the big media announcement like so many other Assoc are having around the State.

- Finalisation of the Lease we are constantly following up this with Council and are close to seeing a draft of the new lease arrangements
- Continue to increase revenue from non-playing member streams and sponsorship to ensure we minimise the cost impact to our members.
- Continue to lodge numerous grant applications for items around the complex We were successful this season with some new goals for the water field valued at \$7,500 from the NSW Office of Sport. We were unsuccessful in obtaining funds for new shelters to extend off the water field dugouts for sun and rain protection but we will continue to lodge submissions for these in the new season
- Increase volunteer efforts for events here on the Coast to prevent burnout of the few passionate people we have providing their support at all events

Thank you to all of our Assoc coaches and managers who get the teams out on the pitch each week. Thank you to the all members of committees that volunteer their time and sanity to the club. Your week to week efforts with all teams are the keys to our continued successes. I can only ask that other members of clubs look for opportunities where they can give back to the club that provides you and your families so much.

Thank you to all our Assoc committee members for their support and extra efforts over this past season. Without your commitment much of this work would not have happened.

Finally I'd to take this opportunity to once again thank my fellow Board Members for their support and commitment this year. It is always great to get new people involved and this brings new ideas and renewed energy to the rest of us. It was refreshing to have almost all Board roles filled and other people assisting our Board members when required to run our competitions. I hope this continues to flourish into the 2019 season.



Treasurers Report Cheryl Flannery

2018, another busy year for CENTRAL COAST HOCKEY, our third complete year as an associated & amalgamated body. Everyone has worked together in co-operation to achieve another successful year for hockey on the Central Coast. Please find herewith a copy of the audited books (accrual reporting) prepared by Saige and a summary of the Income & Expenditure (cash reporting) prepared by myself.

This year, I will not stand for the position of Finance Director as I feel this needs to be filled from a member of the hockey community. I am looking to mentor anyone who may have an interest to take on all or PART of the position. As our accounting system is completely online, it lends itself to multi operators. MYOB, bookkeeping or accounting experience would be an advantage but not essential. Please feel free to speak with me if you feel you would like to get involved.

As of 2018 all billing, including Clubs, Reps and Outside Hire has been processed through MYOB. It is a task to co-ordinate and I have found that collection of payments is a particularly time consuming & challenging component that needs to be addressed further. My recommendations are that we offer multiple payment options along with calendar reminder when sending invoices and clearly outline consequences for late & non-payers and be prepared to enforce those consequences. Proceeds of affiliation fees collected from members were divided into three main categories; Development & NSW Fees, Facilities & Finance. This enabled us to support development programs, subsidise representative costs and contribute towards ongoing improvements & maintenance to our complex.

Our clubs' competition and training turf hire billing continues as a single annual bill, paid in instalments and updated at the end of the season. Thank to all the Club contacts and treasurers who have ensured prompt payments and an easy flow of communication.

The canteen & bar saw almost a 30% profit, thanks to Carol Madden & the team of volunteers for their tireless work in the canteen. I would recommend that we try to get some funding to improve the POS register in the near future.

We have tried to keep spending to a minimum this year to focus on accumulating funds. Savings towards our New Turf for the year total \$119400 bringing our balance to \$371918. \$305000 of this in an interest bearing term deposit.

We gratefully received Grants for \$5500 from WSC to host the u15 Indoor State Championships & \$6000 from Sports & Leisure for a pair of international Hockey Goals. Thanks to Brett and Tracey for all the hard work it takes to realise these grants.

Thank you to Michael Kay & Tuggerah Freight Management who generously sponsored \$1000 for Minkey singlets and our new relationship with neighbours, Wyong Golf Club saw a \$3000 first instalment of a sponsorship agreement.



Thanks to Board members Jodie & Peter, also Anne Mcphail, Dwayne Hutchinson and David Eccleston for co-ordinating the Competition Umpiring details.

Thanks to Claire Mercer for keeping tabs of all things Minkey and presenting me with an accurate account of the years takings and spending.

Complex Report

Mick Jones

The 2018 Hockey season was another very busy year for the Hockey Complex Team including myself especially having taken up the roll for the first time this year.

For myself especially I was able to witness firsthand the dedication and hard work that goes behind the scenes of running and operating our complex. Not only during the weekends when the competition is running, but also during the week days. Including the long 'out of hours' of maintenance and repairs that are carried out when everyone has gone home and some cases are still in bed during the early hours of the morning when contractors have to be given access to our complex or the lawns need mowing (that takes on average 5 hours to complete). And yes, it is fun.

It was big year for the complex with storms in May causing just under \$5000 worth of damage to our lights, water cannons and score boards. Our complex now has for the first time 'Conditions of Hire' for when outside stakeholders (sporting clubs, other hockey associations) use our facilities they our now bound by a contract to ensure they look after our complex and any damage or misuse of our fields are dealt with financial penalties and/or removal from the complex.

We also signed a new contract with Suez rubbish collection saving our association up to 60% in fees. The Central Coast Council also re-painted our carpark and requests have been forwarded to Council have our carpark re-surfaced in 2019. Our Complex Lease negotiations with the Central Coast Council are still ongoing and hope to be in a draft form sometime early 2019.

All lights in our toilets, canteen, change rooms and breezeway are all now turned on automatically saving our association money on power bills. All our canteens electrical appliances were tagged and tested in March to ensure WHS compliance. Our canteen's hot water system was repaired and shelving was installed in the canteens storeroom to remove stock off the floor to prevent back injuries and falls. Total Fire Solutions were also on site this year conducting fire safety inspections on our emergency lighting and inspecting and replacing old fire extinguishers.

Our water tank level indicator was repaired and adjusted and graffiti was removed from our water tank and is waiting to be re-painted. Graffiti was also removed from other structures from around our complex. Photos were taken of the graffiti and sent to the NSW Police Graffiti Unit for identification and possible prosecution of offenders.

Repairs to our sand turf were ongoing due to its age and repairs were made to both the water and sand turf nets. Our complex maintenance equipment (brush cutters, leaf blower and ride-on) were all taken off site for major repairs and servicing. This ensure greater safety for those using this equipment and will add longer life to the machinery.

This year also saw a change of guard when we said good bye to our long serving grounds woman Tracy Malone. Tracy had been in the role for over 7 years and her knowledge and exhausting hard work at the



complex didn't go unnoticed by those who visited our complex. Expressions of Interest were sort for a suitable replacement and Laurie Harris was the successful candidate. Laurie's background working with Gosford City Council for over 30 years in parks and maintenance including working as a senior overseer of maintenance and grounds with the Department of Corrective Services for 15 years proved to be an ideal replacement for our complex.

In closing I'd like to thank my fellow Directors Cheryl, Lynne, Jodie, Brett, Gav and Pete for their encouragement and ongoing support they have shown me during the year even though at times I was completely lost with all the technical jargon of by-laws, competition rules, protests, competition operations of both indoor and outdoor for men's and women's, competition finances and the list goes on. It truly has opened my eyes as a player, coach, selector and parent of just how much hard work and sacrifice goes into running an association and competition like ours. I would not be wrong in saying it truly runs on blood, sweat and tears.

If I'm re-elected for another year, I'm looking forward to an even bigger year for our complex with more changes forecasted to come to improve our complex and make it into one of the most envied hockey facilities in NSW. It's going to be an even busier and exciting year in 2019.
