Directors Reports

President's Report Brett Johnson

Let me start by saying first off congratulations to all our members, supporters and volunteers for a very successful season. Whilst the year ran smooth and looked hassle free, there has certainly been a busy year behind the scenes with a lot of work going on in the background. My first year as President has been a very challenging yet a rewarding year. There has been an enormous commitment from numerous people, with time and resources offered freely over this year which has been above what I expected or had seen in the past. Their selfless approach to the needs of this association has been extraordinary and without these people we would not have seen the great advances that have been made this year.

As the end of 2016 draws to a close everyone at CCHA should be proud as this season has seen many fantastic results, both on field and off field.

- Combined our Div 1 womens comp with Newcastle to create the Hunter Coast Womens PHL Comp
- > Held the inaugural Presidents forum to ensure there was clarity with the clubs to our objectives
- Played the 'Çity of Origin' games for both men and women with much success and looking to continue this as a regular fixture on the hockey calendar
- Our U18 Boys won the Div 1 State Title with many believing that this is possibly the 1st time a CCHA team has achieved this feat
- Our association hosted hockey events for the NSW Academy Games and both the HNSW U13 and U15 Indoor State titles
- > Conducted a combined Grand Final day which was well supported by all clubs and supporters.

Also on the field we continue to develop our coaching and player programs. These areas will continue to benefit from increased support and resources. Greg Doolan (HNSW RCC) has continued to play a predominant role with coach and player development in 2016 and this is reflected in the number of players and Coaches /Managers that our region has provided this season to NSW teams of all ages.

Off field work is often just important as playing the game. This year we had an increased focus on utilising our social media to communicate to members what's happening on and off the field and it has been very successful with the total membership currently at 581 members. We also created a public facing CCHA page so that we can share our success with friends and family and other members of the community who may be interested in our sport. We also had a new website with the help of Andy Duggan that provided the ability to share draws and pointscores and other news and information. Whilst a little clunky at times it was still a step forward then having to access 3 different sites. The good news is that the new website is even better

This year has seen some massive projects undertaken led ably by Barry Dowd. Our water turf was successfully cleaned which removed years of grime and has brought it back to top condition and will ensure will increase its lifespan considerably. We were successful with a grant from the NSW Ministry of Sport & Rec to conduct maintenance work on the Lighting on both the sand and water fields. This was completed midseason and is the first time in a long time that 100% of field lighting has been operational. We were also successful with a number of other smaller grants to support other activities that we have completed this year.



A quick look into 2017 and there are quite a few exciting opportunities ahead:

- > The Assoc is currently debt free which means we will continue to deposit the previous loan repayment of \$5,500 per month into savings to be allocated towards the turf replacement meaning we currently have a healthy surplus.
- > Continued focus on identifying additional revenue streams from non-hockey partners to reduce the financial impact on our members
- Continue to lobby Local, State & Federal Government for Grants to match our savings contribution to the new turf
- Continued progress on planning for the replacement of the sand turf and associated facility upgrades with hopes to have this 'shovel-ready' by end of 2017 season.
- > Smooth introduction of the new registration portal that will hopefully streamline a lot of work for clubs and CCHA admins; as well as simplify manual tasks in collating game cards and match results and website updates
- Introduction of a pre-season School gala day as well as a come try hockey day to attempt to attract some additional players to our sport;
- introduction of a brand new CCHA Rep uniform to bring us into line with the HNSW reform requirements;

Thank you to our major sponsors; The Entertainment Grounds who have once again kindly contributed grants towards the new rep uniform as well as hosting our Junior Rep Presentation nights; Elite Hockey and Aaron McCarthy who came on board on the last minute this season but was regularly at the fields ready to supply you with any of your hockey equipment needs. We will continue to grow these relationships next season

Thank you to all our committee members for their support and extra efforts over this year of change. Without your commitment much of this work would not have happened. I would also like to thank the greater CCHA Hockey community for their achievements, efforts and support for the year, it's been a year full of many great achievements.

Finally I'd to take this opportunity to sincerely thank my fellow Board Members for their support and commitment this year. After a busy 12 months we have remained focussed, committed, and passionate to make Central Coast Hockey one of our region's leading sporting associations. I would like to make special mention of Cheryl Flannery for all her efforts in managing the accounts and ensuring that we continue to When you hear comments from our members about how much we have managed to do this past year it goes someway to make up for the many late nights finalising plans etc. I am very grateful to be working with a group of dedicated people and proud to be involved in this wonderful sport we love and play.

We have achieved many great outcomes and laid a solid platform to start 2017 positively.





2016, a huge year CENTRAL COAST HOCKEY, our first complete twelve-month year as an amalgamated body from a financial viewpoint. New challenges faced, new waters crossed, a big year of shared responsibilities & learning that is ever progressive!

With the support of the Junior & Women's assistant treasurers we successful underwent a transition to simplify competition billing, this worked really well, thankyou Julie & Trish, your attention to detail, work ethic and support has been invaluable. Julie also in the role of booking officer, undertook invoicing of schools making the whole process more efficient enabling funds to flow to CCH in a shorter timeframe. Systems were put in place to process bulk payments efficiently to our competition umpires, thanks you to the umpire convenors, Cassidy, Michelle & Trish, Mark & Brett.

As the year progressed new accounts were established, first a dedicated Rep Account where without the articulate book keeping of Mark and Jackie and Irene's knowledge of everything reps, I would have been completely lost. An account for Minkey with proceeds transferred from CCWHA's care to CCH followed, thanks to Claire for keeping tabs of all things Minkey. A Development Fund was set up and injected with funds from the closure and final amalgamation of CCMHA and an Indoor Comp account is just starting to get a workout.

All-important funds for a new playing surface have been saved, the Fund including a Term Deposit totalling \$97000 at the season close and growing each month.

Thanks to Brett who in kept on top of payments through my absence; Pam always made an immediate response her priority for every payment that needed authorisation; Barry perfectly maintained the Maintenance Fund receipts and spreadsheet.

We gratefully received Grants from both WSC and Sport & Rec and Sponsorship from The Entertainment Grounds and Priority Lawyers; thanks to Tracey & Andrew's dedication to the task. Expenditure of the Lighting Grand received last year has been completed.

Proceeds of affiliation fees collected from CCH members were divided into four categories Development, Facilities, NSW Fees & Other Expenses, this enabled us to support development programs, subsidise representative costs and continue to improve & maintain our complex.

The Canteen saw the addition of EFTPOS PAYWAY, experiencing some teething problems with connections, however this now seems to be up and running and has added convenience for the canteen customers.

I would like to thank my fellow board members for their passion for Hockey and the team of supporting volunteers that I have enjoyed a good working relationship with, I acknowledge Julie Clarke (Assistant Treasurer Juniors & Bookings) Trish Halls (Assistant Treasurer Women) Irene Tweedie and Mark Jeffrey (Junior Reps) Jackie Sinclair and Brigette Burcher (Women's Masters) Carol Madden (Canteen supervisor)

The 2016 season has been a year of getting things done. There has been an enormous amount of Maintenance, Upgrades and Repairs to the Complex and Playing Fields during the 2016 year.

Most of these are covered below:

- 1. Major repairs to Sand Field, 4 days required.
- 2. Cleaning of Water Turf, cleaned by Turf X, (8 days required).
- 3. Shipping Container and Shelving installed, (5 days required).
- 4. Refurbishment, Repairs & Maintenance of Floodlights on Sand & Water fields, (7 days required)
- 5. Concreting, widening of pathways and upgrading drainage, (7 days required).
- 6. Water Field Water Cannons, Maintenance and Repairs to Pumps, Underground and Above Ground water tanks, (10 days required).
- 7. Sewer Problem repaired.
- 8. Insect Zapper installed in Canteen and new shelf and permanent step added to front of the canteen.
- 9. Tag & Test of all Electrical Appliances and Extension Leads.
- 10. Ride-On Mower Servicing and Repairs on Site.
- 11. Fitting of 5 new Tap sets in Canteen, Toilets and Change rooms.
- 12. Replaced 8 faulty Shower Heads.
- 13. Painting of Exterior of Clubhouse.
- 14. Roof Storage (Attic) tidied/cleared and Shelving fitted.
- 15. Key Register Cabinet fitted and all old Keys sorted and a Key Register compiled.
- 16. Fitted 2 new doors to Electrical Switchroom and fitted Awning to protect same.
- 17. Fitted 2 new Sensor Security Lights on southern wall of Clubhouse.

I have enjoyed my year and I feel very satisfied on the amount of improvements that has been carried out to our Complex and Turfs in the past 12 months.

Thanks to Jim Bissaker for his assistance to me throughout the year when I have asked for it. Also thanks to the volunteers that have offered their help throughout the year to work on special projects.

I would like to thank Tracey Malone for her expertise in caring for the Grounds and keeping the Complex clean, also thanks to Pam Goodwin for her assistance to Tracey, their commitment is greatly appreciated.

Julie Clarke has done a very professional job again as CCH Booking Officer, this position has had its frustrations throughout the year, but Julie has overcame these and moved on. Julie has always helped me if I require someone to open the gates or check on something at the Complex at short notice, thanks for your effort throughout the year.

Carol Madden's position as Canteen and Purchasing Officer has been another very successful year, Carol has catered for the Woongarrah Soccer, Women's & Men's Competitions, Academy Games, a few school games and the recent Bushrangers weekend.

In 2016 we implemented the Sponsorship and Fundraising role to identify opportunities to increase the revenue streams from non-hockey playing members.

It has been a trial and error year trying to work out what works and how to identify prospective sponsors and what we can offer sponsors in return.

Firstly I would like to thank the sponsors that went with us in 2016 and I hope that they will continue with us into the future. These Sponsors include The Entertainment Grounds, Priority Business Lawyers, C Mobile, Elanora Hotel, Elite Hockey and A man with a Chainsaw.

This year we took on a new hockey equipment supplier in Elite Hockey. In this first year Aaron also had to set up his main base at Pennant Hills Hockey Complex. Thus in 2016 he was quite stretched and could not set up at Wyong permanently.

In 2017 we will continue our association with Elite Hockey but we will see him possibly permanently or more frequently. We are also negotiating arrangements to offer 'new to hockey' discounts to implement in the commencement of the 2017 season.

Another massive initiative implemented by the board in 2016 was Bar facilities and the ability to sell alcohol with our own liquor licence. We test drove this on Grand Final day with great success. We thank the Elanora Hotel, East Gosford for all their help and all the players and spectators that supported this venture. So from 2017 we will have bar facilities every weekend. We are in the middle of negotiating a sponsorship deal with The Elanora Hotel for next year which will be great. The Elanora Hotel was also a sponsor of our State Indoor Championships at Niagara Park Stadium this year.

We are also currently revisiting some of our current arrangements to identify opportunities with local Business that will ultimately provide a better deal for our members.

In regards to grants, I thank Tracy Southern for coming on board this year and organizing all the work that is involved. We received several grants over the last 12 months which has helped complete a number of projects or purchase of much needed equipment for the complex.

I would also like to thank the 2 local members for Wyong in David Harris and Emma McBride. They are great supporters of Hockey on the coast as evident by their appearance on Grand Final day.

Leading into 2017 our goals are simple – to identify partnerships with the local community to assist us to develop hockey on the coast and get the sand turf replaced immediately.

Brett Johnson and myself have been working on a 2017 Sponsorship Package for any potential Sponsor that fully outlines what CCHA can offer and what they can get out of sponsoring Central Coast hockey. It is about



building partnerships. If we can utilize businesses at The Hockey Centre, they will give back in the way of sponsorship. Then we as participants/supporters will also use them personally. Primary focus is to hopefully identify a major sponsor who can assist with the purchase of the new CCHA rep uniform leading into the 2017 season

It's a work in progress but we will be getting the proposal out to all our database .Please read it and if you think you want to help out and be a part of this please don't hesitate to ask.

In conclusion, it's been a very challenging year with sponsorship but I feel we are slowly getting there. You should all be proud of the great work the Central Coast Hockey Board are doing. They are dedicated and each of them put in very long hours for our association.

The committee came up with a number of suggestions that were implemented over the course of the season:

- A single CCHA match card that is now used across all competitions.
- Introduction of a Tech Bench official to manage games.
- Standardised some rules across all competitions, eg stick above the head now in Mens Womens and U17.
- Creation of the U17 9-a-side competition to create a fast paced and exciting competition with amended rules. Changing to this format also allowed some clubs to split their teams to avoid the potential of losing players form this age group.
- Introduction of penalty shootouts in Grand Finals.
- Flexibility to adjust the guidelines to the challenges faced in the Womens competition this year with

There were a number of challenges faced over the course of the year that we have learnt from and will endeavour to improve next year. Leading into 2017 the intention is to ensure that all clubs have representatives at the committee meetings so that informative decisions can be made and information is passed back to club committees for communication with members.

2016 has been a successful season with the continued growth and progression of junior hockey on the Central Coast. The junior competition continued on from the previous season with no reportable incidents which is a testament to those involved with the junior competition at association, club, player and spectator levels

The 2016 junior competition seen teams from Avoca, Erina, Gosford, Grammar, Norah Head, The Entrance, Wyoming and Wyong participate across our 5 age groups along with participants in our Minkey program. Overall team numbers increased from the previous season to a total of 39 teams across the age groups as outlined below:
