Thank you to all our Association committee members for their support and extra efforts over this past season. Without your commitment much of this work would not have happened.

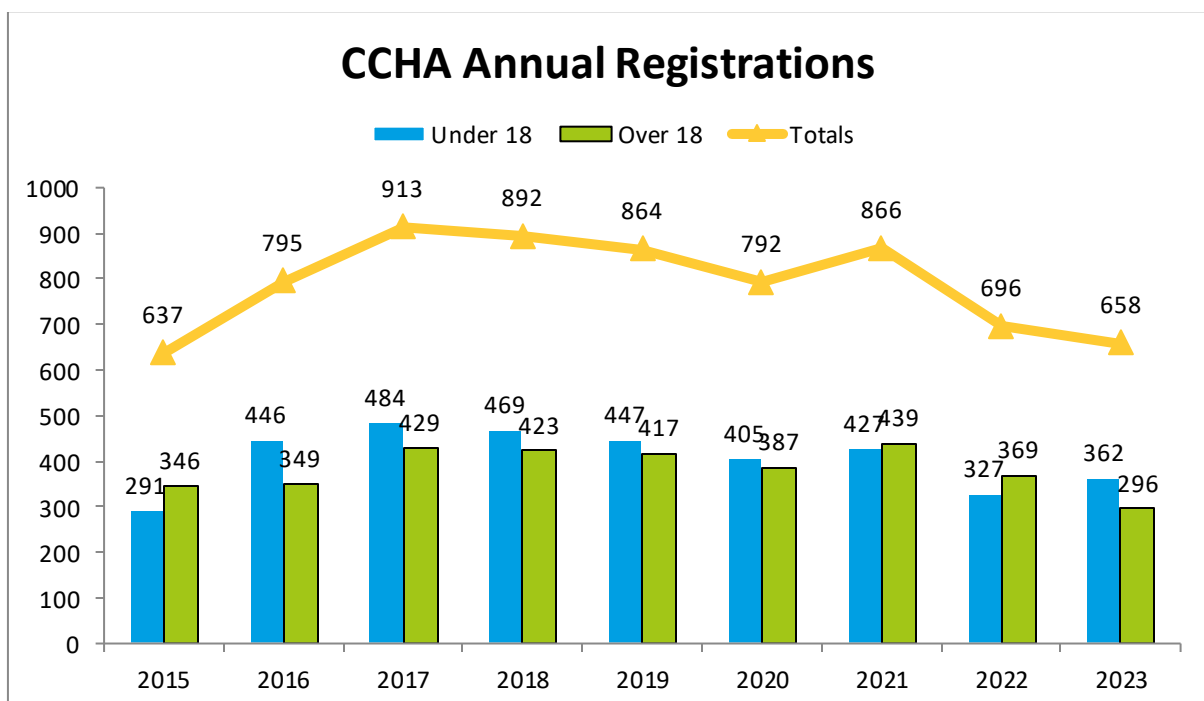
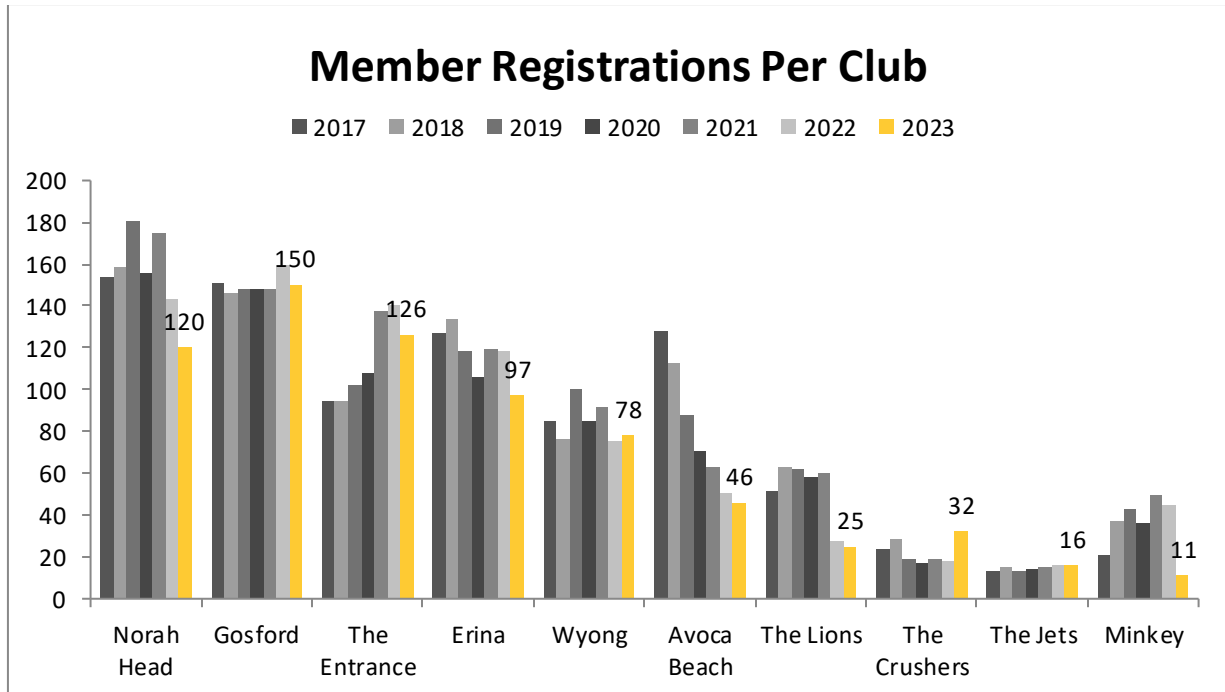

This was the first time I had taken on the role of Grants and Sponsorship and quickly became aware of how big the job was and the time that was needed to undertake and keep up with what was required.

I would like to thank those that helped out in preparing grants and following through on applications, without these people we could not have done and will not be able to do the things that ultimately cost vast sums of money and would eventually come out of our members pockets.

Firstly, thanks to Jodi Livesley, Jodi has helped over the last few years submitting grants and thankfully Jodi continued again this year. Jodi would just send through an email randomly, with either this grant, or that grant she had worked on and submitted on our behalf. It may have crossed her desk or was something where she saw the opportunity that CCHA could benefit from. Thanks also to Tracey Mexon and Brett Johnson for continually filling out grants for opportunities that may exist.

At present we are working through spending a \$10,000 grant for the manufacture of Hockey 5s courts and hope to have 2 full sets finished and ready for some exciting events in the future. Brett is also communicating on the last lighting upgrade in which we were successful with a grant (\$168,000) and this will hopefully be ready for next season, reducing our overall energy use and helping reduce costs to families. Small grants such as upgrades to our competition and operational process has seen a grant for \$2000 for the purchase of iPads for entering team attendance and scores while at the complex to reduce the hours spent of our volunteers manually entering game cards.

Thanks also to Blake Murdoch and Mick Tweedie for establishing a link with Wyong Leagues Group and Brett Johnson for working through an exciting new Major Sponsor deal for CCHA that will be broadcast to our community once all relevant administration has been signed off on.

This year we also started the Training Pass opportunity where members could play a yearly fee to use the complex twice a week. This allowed those that were interested to use the facilities as well as establishing more of a presence at the Centre.

Pre-Season Rep Squad Training Sessions

- Rep Squad training sessions were held prior to selections.
- These were attended by a substantial number of players on every occasion they were held.
- They were held on Sunday afternoons prior to the season starting and Saturday mornings during the season.
- Thanks to Matt Wark, Dean and Helen Benfield and Jaz Bissaker who attended each and every session we held to coach the players. There were also coaches from all clubs who attended to assist. I Recommend these sessions are held every year.

U/11 Tamworth Carnival

- In 2023 we were again able to send a boys team and a girls team. Post-covid our junior numbers were decimated and a massive thank you to Melanie Stanton (The Entrance) and Jackie Greentree (Gosford) who rallied the troops and got the numbers for two teams.

New Rep Uniform

- This season we invested in a new rep uniform, we consciously made the decision to not put a sponsor on the uniform to ensure the uniforms did not become obsolete as sponsors change.
- We commissioned an indigenous artist, Judith Franklin to create some designs for our association and then through the hard work of Scott Cumming and Cheryl Flannery we managed to come up with an amazing design for our uniforms.
- We held a presentation to unveil the shirts which was attended by some life members, Hockey NSW representatives and Judith Franklin. The shirts were paraded by our U/13 girls rep team prior to the U/13 State Championships at Wyong.
- We also designed and purchased an alternative pair of CCHA rep socks for use when we have a “sock clash” at the State Championships.

CCHA Rep Teams

- This season we sent away 30 rep teams, ranging from U/11 to Masters.
- This included over 64 officials (Coaches, Assistant Coaches and Managers)
- We had over 35 “new players” to represent CCHA for the first time in season 2023.
- We had 7 new officials to join the ranks of the CCHA volunteer rep machine which keeps our teams on the pitch and looking good in our uniforms.

General Information

- All coaches and managers were appointed by the Board (voted on by Board members)
- All teams were selected by a group of 3 independent selectors and then ratified by the Board
- All teams had 2 separate trial dates
- All players attended a minimum of 1 trial unless an exemption was obtained

- Teams had minimum of 3 training sessions
- Training sessions were booked in January 2023 – Sunday Afternoons, set time, this allowed all teams to get field time.

NSW Representatives

- In 2023 we had 23 athletes selected in NSW State Squads and 10 athletes selected in NSW State teams
- In 2023 we had 3 athletes selected in the Pride Squads, Lain Carr, Michael Taylor and Ella Carr. With Micheal Taylor and Ella Carr being selected in the teams.
- During this season we also had several coaches selected to coach at a NSW level, including Mark McDermott, Katie Nolan, Mark Graham and Tracey Preston.

Junior Rep Presentation

Junior Rep Presentation is booked for 17/11/2023 at Wyong Hockey Centre – both indoor and field rep seasons to be included in one presentation. This event will be utilised to trial new “Hockey 5’s” set up.
