President's Report

2017 has been another big season for all involved in Central Coast Hockey

As the end of 2017 draws to a close everyone at CCHA should be proud as this season has seen many fantastic results, both on field and off field.

- Implemented a whole of association uniform with a new colour scheme so thank you to all that had a hand in implementing that
- We secured a liquor licence and ran our bar from the canteen. Thank you to Carl for her support and also all the members and guests who supported this and also behaved in accordance with the regulations to ensure this important revenue stream was put in jeopardy
- Had much success at State Champs this season with both the Open Womens and U13 girls winning their Div 2 titles and securing positions in Div 1 next season. Also our Open Mens securing semi-final spot for the 1st time in memory. This led to a significant amount of players into NSW state squads this squad
- Implemented a new registration portal – Revolutionise. This has allowed all registrations to be collected simply, rep invoicing, publishing of draws and points scores a lot simply then past seasons
- Initiated a Central Coast Academy of Sport Hockey program with an inaugural squad of 20 athletes
- Hosted the Hunter Kookaburra cup, the 2017 Academy Games Hockey program & 2017 Boys PSSA State Championships
- Hosted the U13 & U15 Hunter Indoor cup & the 2017 U15 Boys/Girls HNSW Indoor State Championships
- Transitioned our banking from Westpac to Bendigo Bank Wyong
- Had the first Grand Final decided by Penalty Shootouts with the U17 Grand Final this season going down to the wire

All of these items take a lot of organisation and support so I would like to thank the many volunteers that have helped out at any time throughout the season. Without your efforts and dedicated none of this happens.

I would also like to thank our Major sponsors; The Entertainment Grounds, The Elanora Hotel, Optimum Health & Performance, Bendigo Bank Wyong & Elite Hockey. We look forward to continued support into the next season

As like past seasons, there are always unexpected challenges that arise and need to be dealt with and this season has been no different. As like past seasons the first challenge comes as teams are being finalised which ultimately dictates how our competition is formed. Whilst this challenges traditional structures I would like to thank people for accepting the decisions and allowing the hockey to be played. Other challenges to be addressed into 2018:

- Update the competition by-laws to incorporate the new changes to our competition structures

- Continue to increase revenue from non-playing member streams and sponsorship to ensure we minimise
- Continue to lobby Central Coast Council for additional financial support with replacement of the Sand Turf
- Develop strategies to assist more junior umpires transition into the Senior Competition
- Develop an Association Volunteer plan to assist with whole of association events and activities rather than continue to allow the same people that are supporting their club have to also support the Assoc.

Thank you to all our committee members for their support and extra efforts over this past season. Without your commitment much of this work would not have happened. I would also like to thank the greater CCHA Hockey community for their achievements, efforts and support for the year, despite some of the bumps over the course of the season on the whole it is still a year full of many great achievements.

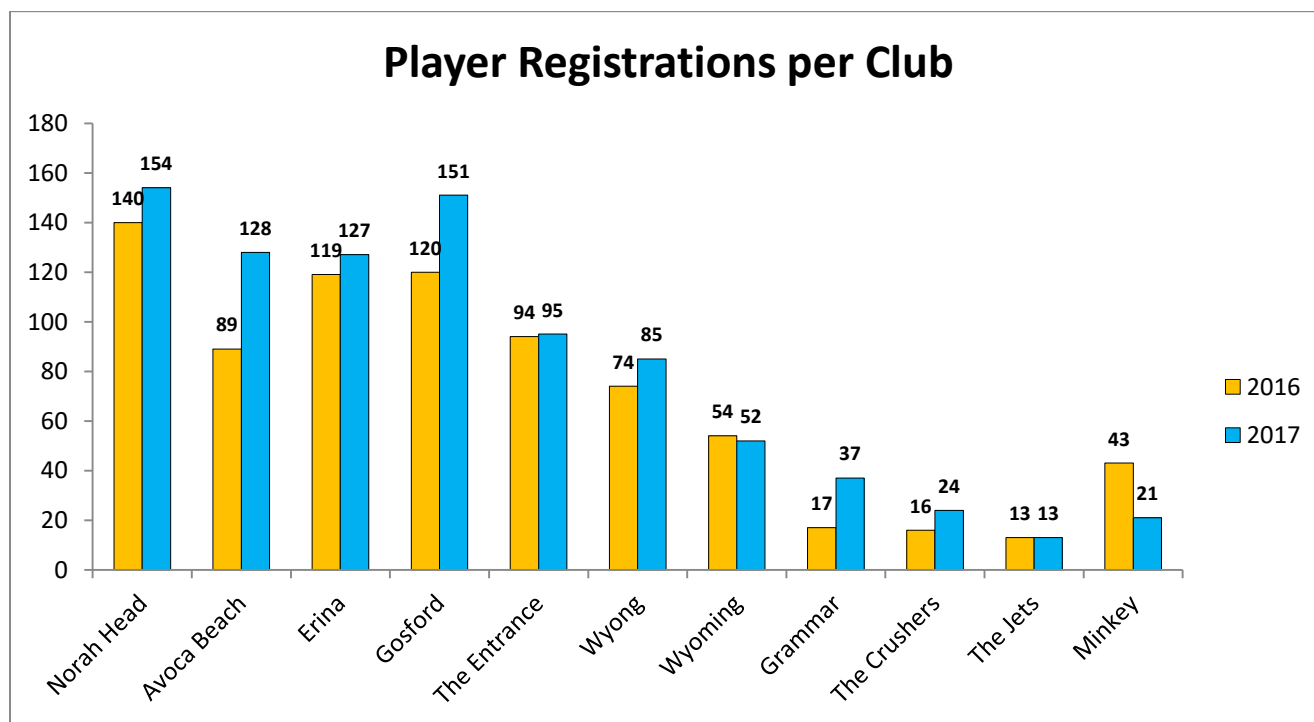

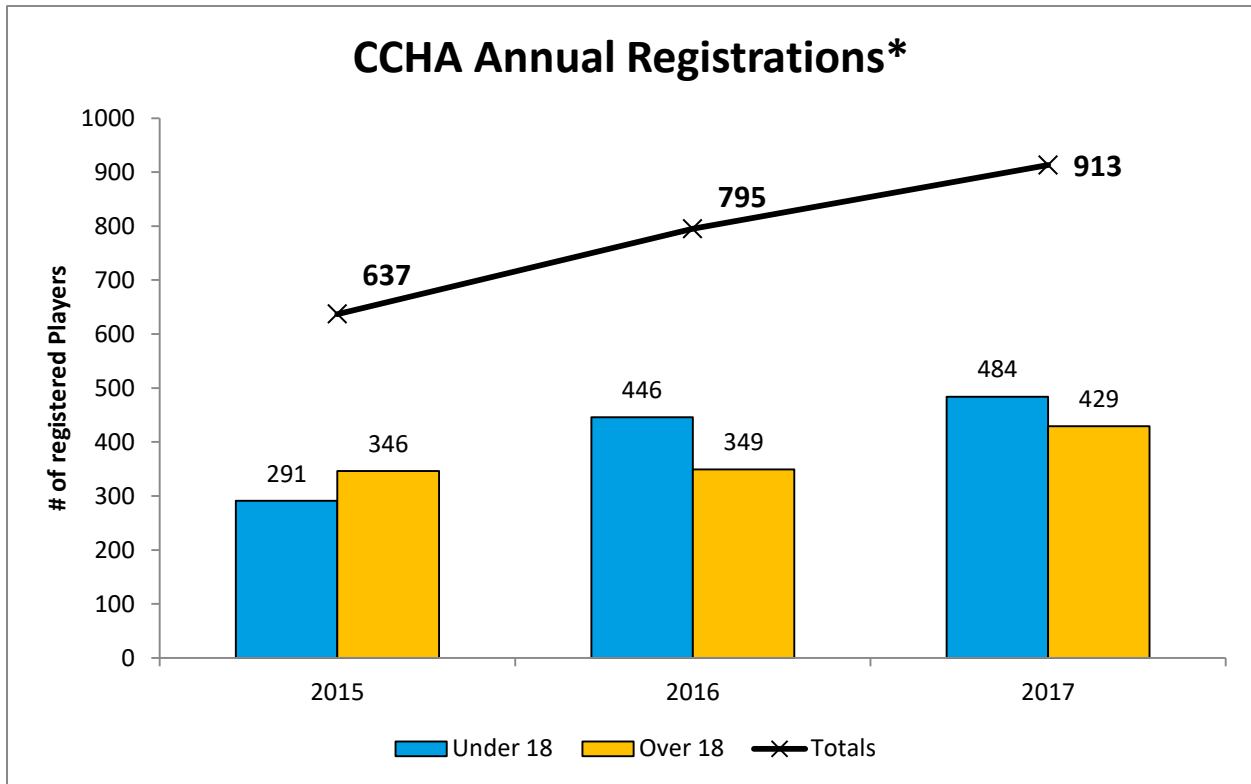

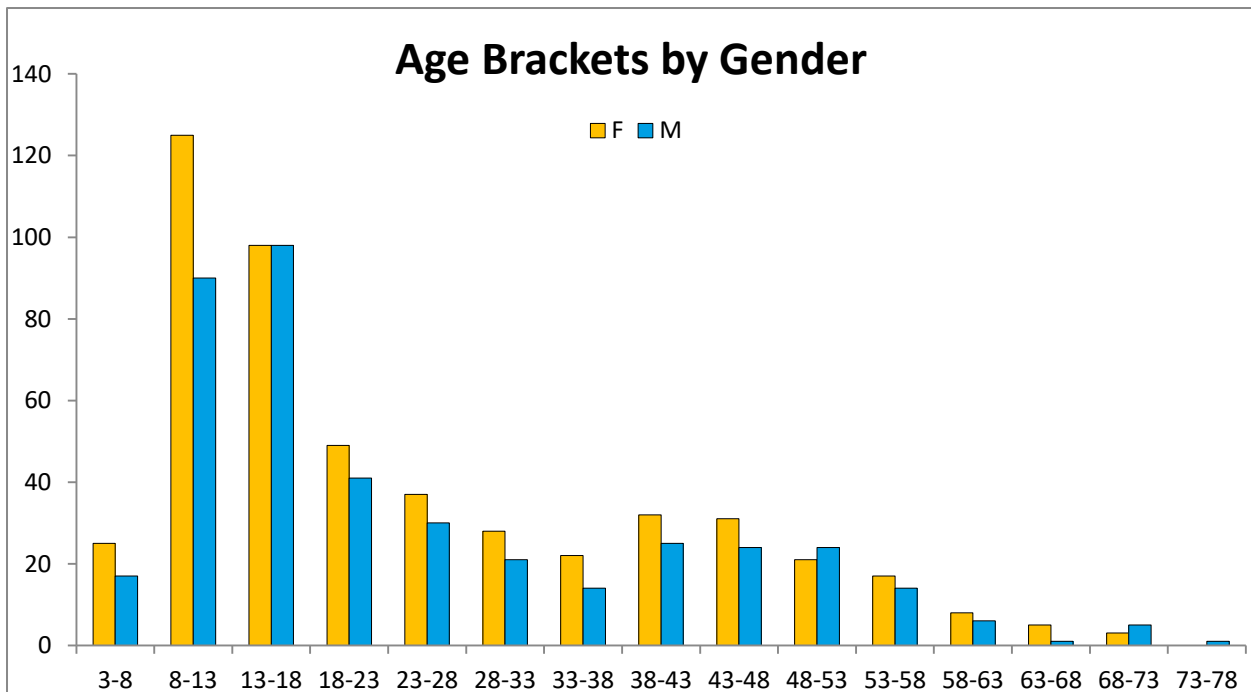

It is essential the Board be given the support of all Clubs and volunteers to develop our great sport of hockey in the central coast.

My thanks to club secretaries and my fellow board members for your support over the last year and congratulations and thanks to Brett for his tireless efforts as President in 2017.

It has been my pleasure to assist and serve as Director of Administration.

Treasurers Report

2017, another busy year for CENTRAL COAST HOCKEY, our second complete year as an amalgamated body.

With a lot of invaluable support from all the CCHA Directors we have successfully undertaken some major accounting changes:

- 1) the introduction of the Revolutionise Sports Management platform. Here, all our registrations, affiliations, reps, indoor comp and outside turf hire billing is controlled.
- 2) a completely new set of accounts & a subscription to MYOB online Essential Accounting system providing up to the minute balancing with direct feeds daily from our bank transactions and also has the ability to share with our accountant.
- 3) the movement of all our banking to Bendigo Bank.

CCWHA & CCJHA both finalised their amalgamation this year and now we are completely ONE! Funds from both associations were deposited into the New Turf Fund and together with our savings are currently in an interest bearing term deposit of \$200,000. There is a further ever growing \$100,000 ready to be locked in from the next term.

We gratefully received a Grant for \$5,800 from WSC to purchase Marquees and a sponsorship from the Elanora Hotel. Thanks to Brett, Andrew and Tracey for making this happen.

Proceeds of Affiliation fees collected from members were divided into three main categories Development & NSW Fees, Facilities & Expenses, a Finance Honorarium was paid & Rep Uniforms purchased over the season. This enabled us to support development programs, subsidise representative costs and contribute towards ongoing improvements & maintenance to our complex.

Our clubs' competition and training turf hire billing is now a single annual bill, paid in instalments and updated at the end of the season. This was well received & I thank all the Club contacts and treasurers who have ensured prompt payments and an easy flow of communication.

Jodie, Brett & Gavin have overseen the billing and expenditure for the CCH Reps, this is a huge and important task that I would not have been able to tackle without their hard work and invaluable support.

Trudi Tinker took on the role of booking officer, and together with Barry Dowd communicated with hirers, Trudi created an online calendar and kept me informed & updated with spreadsheets, she also invoiced our school hirers through Revolutionise making the whole process efficient.

Our Maintenance & Maintenance account was closely monitored by Barry Dowd, his attention to detail is impeccable and made my work there easy.

Thanks to Board members Jodie & Brett, also Michelle Watherston and David Eccleston for co-ordinating the Competition Umpiring details, payment efficiency has improved.

Thanks to Claire Mercer for keeping tabs of all things Minkey and presenting me with an accurate account of the year's takings and spending.

Canteen saw a profitable year, there was the inclusion of bar facilities which has been embraced by the community, we also made the move to the SQUARE payment system and haven't looked back since. Thanks to Carol Madden & her team of helpers for their tireless work in the canteen.

Everyone has worked together in co-operation to achieve another successful year for hockey on the Central Coast.

This year, I took on the role of caretaker for the position of Finance Director for the first few months of this year and then agreed to continue as a whole in the position following the absence of an offer from within the hockey community. I am looking to mentor anyone who may have an interest to take on all or part of the position. Please feel free to speak with me if you feel you would like to get involved.

Complex Report

Barry Dowd

The 2017 season has been another year of getting things done. There is always Maintenance, Upgrades and Repairs required to the Complex and Playing Fields.

Most of these are covered below:

1. For the Canteen a new griddle was purchased, a faulty range hood was replaced.
2. Woongarra Soccer hired our grass field for their rego & trail games during Feb & March.
3. Two bar fridges were donated by The Entertainment Grounds.
4. The water field spraying and pumping system had major maintenance carried out. The underground water storage pit was pumped out, gurnied and spotlessly cleaned, a new foot valve was fitted to the pipework in the pit and a priming system was fitted, all pit and above ground tank level switches adjusted, some electrical control system modifications. This system is now working perfectly on automatic control, the first time for many years.
5. The overflow carpark has had repairs and maintenance and is now being mowed and is available for use for special events with CCH board approval.
6. The complex was sprayed for spiders and ongoing maintenance and repairs to both sets of goals.
7. Minor electrical repairs to field lighting.
8. A break-in occurred at the clubhouse on the 24th April. The forensic police were called and minor theft and damage occurred.
9. Tag & Test of all Electrical Appliances and Extension Leads.
10. Ride-On Mower Servicing and Repairs on Site.
11. Hockey field fence repairs were carried out.
12. Eight stainless steel garbage bin containers were donated.
13. New hand towel dispensers and hand foam dispensers were fitted to all toilets and change rooms.
14. Meeting at fields with Central Coast Council and discussed their assistance with the replacement of sand field.
15. Water field score board has been painted.
16. Successful Hunter Academy of Sport and PSSA championships were held at the complex on 7/4 to 9/4 and 29/8 to 31/8 respectively.
17. Turf repairs to the yellow circle inserts on sand field were carried out at the end of day one of the PSSA Championships.

I have enjoyed my year and I feel very satisfied on the amount of improvements that has been carried out to our Complex and Turfs in the past 12 months.

Thanks to Jim Bissaker for his assistance to me throughout the year, we have enjoyed our time working side by side and our individual skills have complimented each other. Also thanks to the volunteers that have offered their help throughout the year to work on special projects.

I would like to thank Tracey Malone for her expertise in caring for the Grounds and keeping the Complex clean.

Trudi Tinker has done a very professional job as CCH Booking Officer, Trudi has set up a Google Calendar for all field bookings which is outstanding. Trudi has helped me if I require someone to open the gates or check on something at the Complex at short notice, thanks for your effort throughout the year.

Carol Madden's position as Canteen and Purchasing Officer has been another very successful year, Carol has catered for the Woongarra Soccer, Women's & Men's Competitions and Grand Final day, Academy Games, PSSA championships and a few school games.

A big thank you to the Clubs and Volunteers that have helped in some way to make the CCH 2017 Season a very successful and enjoyable year.

The junior competition continued on from the previous season with no reportable incidents which is a testament to those involved with the junior competition at association, club, player and spectator levels

The 2017 junior competition seen teams from Avoca, Erina, Gosford, Grammar, Norah Head, The Entrance, Wyoming and Wyong participate across our 5 age groups along with participants in our Minkey program.
