Well, another season has been done and dusted. After many years of disruption, it was pleasing to get a full season of hockey finally completed. The weather tried to do its part to disrupt those plans but unlike most other winter sports we did well to avoid many disruptions

Our 2022 registrations are well down on previous seasons and we have predominately put this down to 2yrs of post Covid hangovers and people particularly wary of another season of disruptions. As you can see from the charts on the following pages, we have probably seen the biggest hit to our competition numbers in the U9 and U11 competitions (compared to 2019 data). In pleasing signs though we have had close to 50 new children come and try hockey during our Term 4 program which has been a major success.

We have continued to attract major events to our facilities and played host to the Hockey NSW U13 Boys State Championships in July. This was a roaring success in terms of financial injection to our Association as evidenced in the Financial report. Many thanks to all the clubs and your volunteers for making this such a fantastic weekend.

Off the field we continue to build strong partnerships with our Local and State Government Ministers and continue to be in the running for many grants. This year we were successful with a \$11,000 grant to install partitions in the 2nd change room for increased privacy.

Another year has passed and we continue to identify new challenges to help drive Central Coast Hockey forward. As always thank you to my fellow Board Members for your continued commitment to Hockey on the Coast.

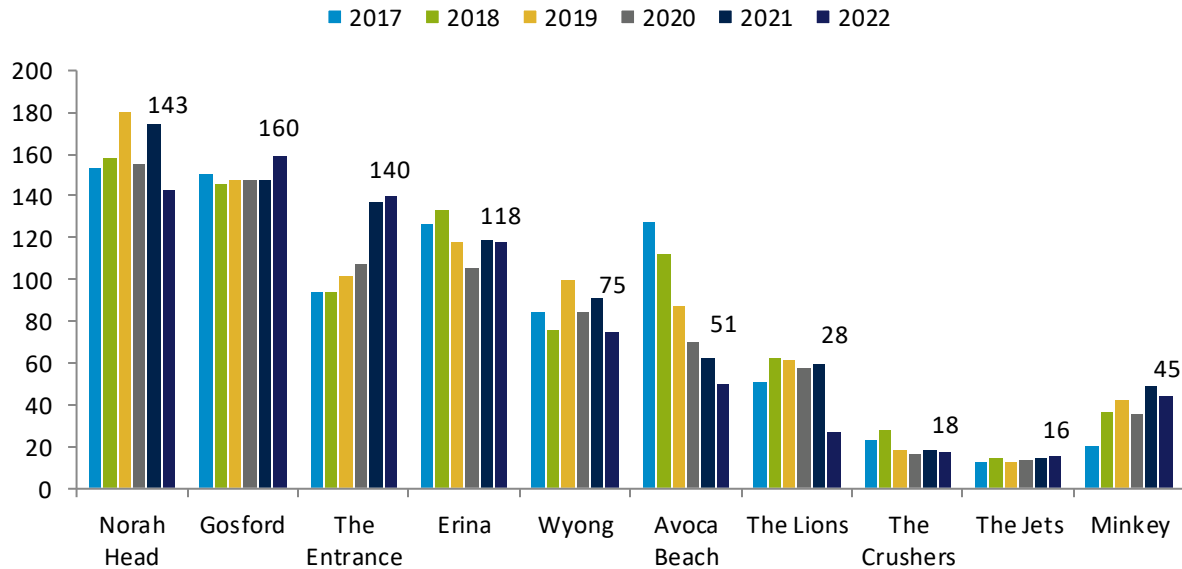

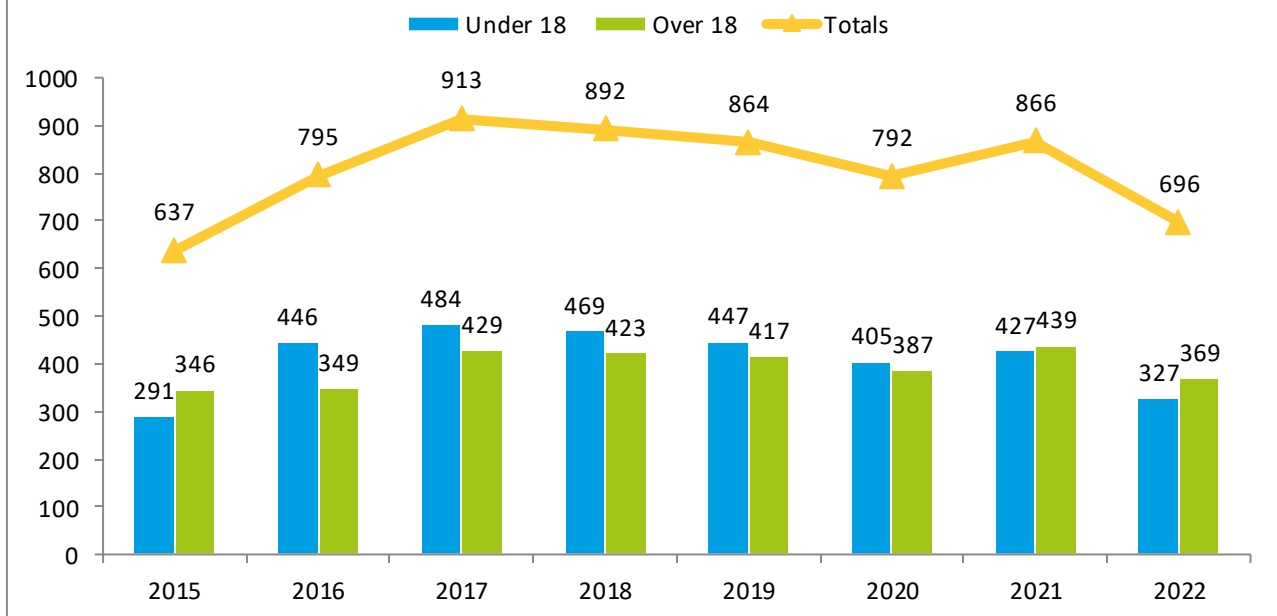

I believe the execution of these particular events was excellent as evidenced by the feedback, all of which is only made possible by the ongoing contribution of members of Clubs who continually step up. It was delightful to see a couple of regular junior faces who give us hope for future generations (I would mention Amber and Lucy but then I would have to mention many more). The additional revenue from the U13's carnival will allow us to refresh our rep uniforms for next season.

Without Carol in the canteen, we relied on members throughout the season to be of service to their peers. Whilst we continued to search for someone to replace Carol, we were unsuccessful, as a result the funds that were collected that would have paid a person to be there will instead be repurposed to build a permanent BBQ, a testament to everyone's assistance.

2022 saw the introduction of a Golf Day, an attempt to create more of a community by having people engage with each other off the pitch. On the pitch Pride Week was embraced thanks to Julie-Ann Gosper. At the back end of the season, we held some workshops around umpiring and how we could make improvements for both the umpire and the player and the outcomes of those sessions will be provided to the Director of Officiating who will be introduced in the 2023 season to oversee umpiring across the



competitions. There is also work to be done around the National Safe Hockey Guidelines, which I hope someone with an interest or expertise in that area could implement for the benefit of all.

Our biggest spend this year \$167 650 +gst was to install LED lighting to both fields, helping to keep the ever-increasing power bills to a minimum, still being our biggest expense each year.

Profits from carnivals have continued to be distributed back to our members with reductions in affiliations fees for all. Canteen operating profits in excess of \$80 000 have also allowed us to cover many expenses and further improve equipment and facilities including the purchase of new keys & locks, a second-hand fridge and seating ready for planned upgrades. Profits from canteen and carnivals will also go a long way for us to make a dent in our wish list of projects and topping up the sinking fund to ensure our future financial security.

I would like to thank my fellow board members, without the support I get from this team, I would be unable to do this job efficiently.

Canteen Carol departed her role for us after years of service, I wish her every good fortune, good health and happiness as she follows her future paths, I also offer her my gratitude and the knowledge that she has been missed. We have so far been unsuccessful in securing a replacement for Carol and the hockey community must be congratulated for stepping up to fill the gap.

Tracey Preston, has taken up the reigns from Julie to be our booking officer, thankyou Tracey for your efforts.

Jackie Sinclair, oversaw the Womens' Masters Rep teams and was a great go between to ensure a smooth run.

Appreciation also to all passionate volunteers, club contacts, administrators, coaches and umpires, players and parents who have prioritised hockey, prompt correspondence and payments. Everyone has worked together in co-operation to achieve a successful year for hockey on the Central Coast.
