# Directors Reports

## President's Report

Brett Johnson

2019 has yet again been another big season for all involved in Central Coast Hockey.

We continue to move forward with plans to replace the sand field in 2020. From this year's Federal election we were provided with a \$500,000 government grant to assist with this project. In addition to the \$135,000 grant from the 2016 election this has enabled us to be closer than ever to replace the sand field. We are currently in negotiations with suppliers and will hopefully have contracts executed shortly. This means that construction works will commence next year and may lead to disruptions in the 2020 season but I am sure getting the new field will outweigh any inconveniences that this causes.

Off the field we continue to develop strong partnerships with our Major Sponsors – Bendigo Bank Wyong, Wyong Golf Club and Optimum Health and Performance. We look forward to their continued support into the future.

This year we were successful with a number of local grants that have assisted us with the following:

- Office of Sport NSW and Central Coast Council Grant for installation of our 2 LED Scoreboards.
- Central Coast Council Grant for hosting the U15 Girls / Boys Indoor State Championships.
- Grant from Bendigo bank Wyong to install a defibrillator at the complex

Our social media channels continue to grow in importance for immediate information sharing and it is now obvious that this method resonates with our players, supporters and officials. In 2019 we have also managed to secure new sponsors via advertising on Instagram

On the field, we continue to provide high quality players and officials to State and Australian squads from our Association.

We continue to upskill our local coaches and umpires and continue to perform well at all State Championships attended.

Our membership base and lack of major growth continues to throw out challenges and this is one facet that requires attention by all clubs moving into 2020.

Once again, I would like to thank all my fellow Board members and their families for their tireless efforts this year. Also, to the club Presidents and committees for you all your support over the past 12 months

## Treasurers Report

Deon Brummer

Please find herewith a copy of the audited books (accrual reporting) prepared by Saige.

This year I have attempted to take over all the responsibilities that Cheryl has so diligently completed in the past and I am truly grateful to her for her continued work and assistance. She deserves a special mention as her tireless, consistent and generous contribution to the crucial financial reporting and management function has not been highlighted nearly enough.

For the 2019 financial year finishing on 30 September 2019 all billing including the Clubs, Representatives and outside hire has been processed through MYOB. With regards the initial registration, this was initiated through Revolutionize in order to facilitate an easier means of ensuring payment and allocation. By doing so it was clear cut whether a member had paid the relevant NSW Hockey component for them to be eligible to play.

As has been the arrangement in the past, the training turf hire and the club competition fees continued as a single annual bill per segment (i.e. men's, women's, juniors), paid in instalments and updated and finalized at the end of the season. This has ensured regular prompt payments and subsequently more evenly spread cashflow. Good communication with treasurers and the designated club contacts have ensured that virtually no major issues were encountered.

I am truly happy to report that the installation of the Square POS system has streamlined the canteen register process and made the payment process that much easier with the tap and go facility. With it being an online solution, the daily reports can now be viewed almost instantaneously and by day end we are able to assess the profitability of the day. I do however believe that we seem to be carrying too many varied stock items and we could simplify and reduce the stock holding. Thanks to Carol Madden and Tracey and the horde of volunteers for their continued and tireless work in preparation and service in the canteen and bar.

We have accumulated \$443 686 in reserves towards our New Water Based Turf. \$311 044 of this value is held in an interest-bearing term deposit and a saving of \$132 642 as at the end of the year. We have been informed that we will receive a substantial grant shortly, but until we see the supporting documentation and the actual cheque, I am hesitant to lay claim to these funds.

## Complex Report

Mick Jones

Another busy year at the complex for our bookings officer, grounds man and canteen supervisor. We started the year off with our annual soccer booking with the Woongarra Soccer Club which generates just under \$10,000 in revenue for our Association. We have also successfully brought on board Tiny-Tots Australia (Rugby) who have hired out our grass field into the New Year generating more revenue for our complex.

Our groundsman and maintenance officer Lozza worked non-stop this year looking after our complex ensuring it was the best sporting complex on the Coast. This was evident from the number of compliments received from contractors, official visitors from Hockey NSW and Central Coast Council Inspectors. This year we purchased a tow-behind spreader to ensure our grass was being fertilised regularly including a tow-behind sprayer to control the weeds and can be used to treat the water turf in regards to algae growth and prevention.

Ongoing maintenance with our water turf in regards to fungus and algae growing on the outside of the field was a major issue and was leading to players slipping over which may have led to injuries and the surface almost unplayable. The solution was getting the field professionally cleaned by our grounds man with the hiring of a commercial cleaning machine. This removed the algae and fungus and stored the waste in the machine thus preventing it from re-entering the drains and ending up back in our storage water tanks and back on the field.

The water turf gutters and back walls behind the goals were high pressure cleaned this year and this removed all the fungus growth which was possibly feeding the affected areas of our water turf. In the New Year the board will look at replacing our aging ride-on lawn mower with a larger and updated ride-on. This will reduce the amount of time mowing and reduce the overall running cost and maintenance of operating the mower.

This year Central Coast Council Inspectors came on site and audited our complex in regards to maintenance and equipment inventory. The Council inspected our canteen, toilets, change rooms, grounds, water pump shed, maintenance container and our turf fields. The Council indicated that they may install new shower partitioning in one of our change rooms and the possibility of issuing and re-keying of our complex due to the number of un-recorded keys in circulation and an attempted break and enter at our complex. The Board will also look at Close Circuit Television cameras for our complex in the coming year to ensure the safety and security of our facilities and for those that use our complex including external users. As of the 14<sup>th</sup> of January the complex received approximately 481mm of rain with the 1<sup>st</sup> of September recording over 180mm of rain in 24 hours.

This year was the first time in almost 7 years that the CCHA had held interviews for the canteen and Carol was reappointed. You can't take away from Carol the incredible work and long hours she has put into the canteen this year and over the past years. Her countless hours during the week in preparation for the weekend's games and not to mention the biggest event of the year our Grand Final weekend where Carol and Tracey worked in excess of 14 hours or more during the Grand Final weekend.

Our canteen was busy as usual and due to the high volume of customers the CCHA hired extra help this year and Tracey Cook came on board to provide extra assistance for Carol in the canteen during our busy Saturday mornings and during the women's competition.

In 2020 the Board are looking at replacing our old coffee and Slushie machines with new ones along with replacing and installing a new commercial deep fryer. The Board are also looking at further improvements to our canteen by redesigning and making the canteen more ergonomic to work in.

In closing I'd to personally thank Carol, Laurie, Julie and Tracey for their thankless and tireless efforts and long hours in ensuring our complex is operationally game ready 365 days a year and I look forward in working with you all in 2020.
