President's Report

Well who would have thought we would ever have the kind of season that 2020 has been.

On the day that the 2020 competition was due to start we had to halt life and go into lockdown. Whilst the competition went into hibernation we were thankfully in a position that we were able to commence replacement of the carpet on the old water field and in April commence demolition of the sand field.

The project was on track to be fully completed by mid July with the resumption of the competition but unfortunately due to some major issues with the sub grade surface and the amount of rain we had during construction we were delayed by 1 month.

I would like to thank the support of the Federal Government, NSW State Government, NSW Office of Sport and Central Coast Council for their financial support for the facility upgrade. I would also like to thank our local Government Ministers David Harris MP and Adam Crouch MP for their continued support of Central Coast Hockey.

I would also like to acknowledge our constructions partners: Polytan Asia Pacific, Goanna Civil Services and Watermatic Irrigation – their efforts in undertaking this work during such a challenging period was amazing.

With the resumption of play in July and the HNSW offer of 2021 Registrations free we only saw a small drop in membership compared to some other associations who were hit harder. We are hopeful that with a Covid free 2021 and 2 new turfs and some fantastic facilities that we will see those players return in 2021.

At the time of writing this we have also conducted our first carnival which was a roaring success and has generated a significant amount of income for the Association. We have also implemented another weekday summer comp which has attracted good numbers and generating additional income in canteen sales. We have a few additional weekends in the pipeline for 2021 and hope soon to be hosting a NSW State Championships in 2022.

Off the field we continue to develop strong partnerships with our Major Sponsors – Bendigo Bank Wyong, Wyong Golf Club and Optimum Health and Performance. We look forward to their continued support into the future.

2020 has been a challenging year like no other so once again I would like to thank my fellow Board members for all their hard work and support in achieving another successful year for Central Coast Hockey

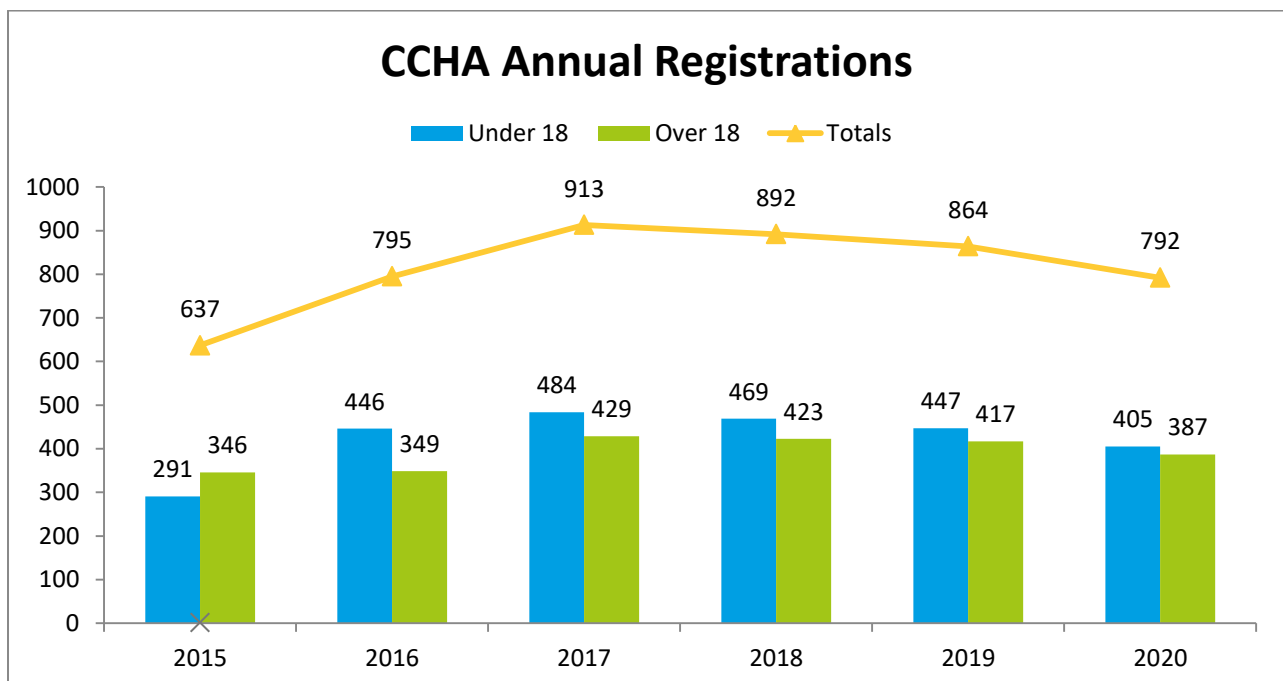
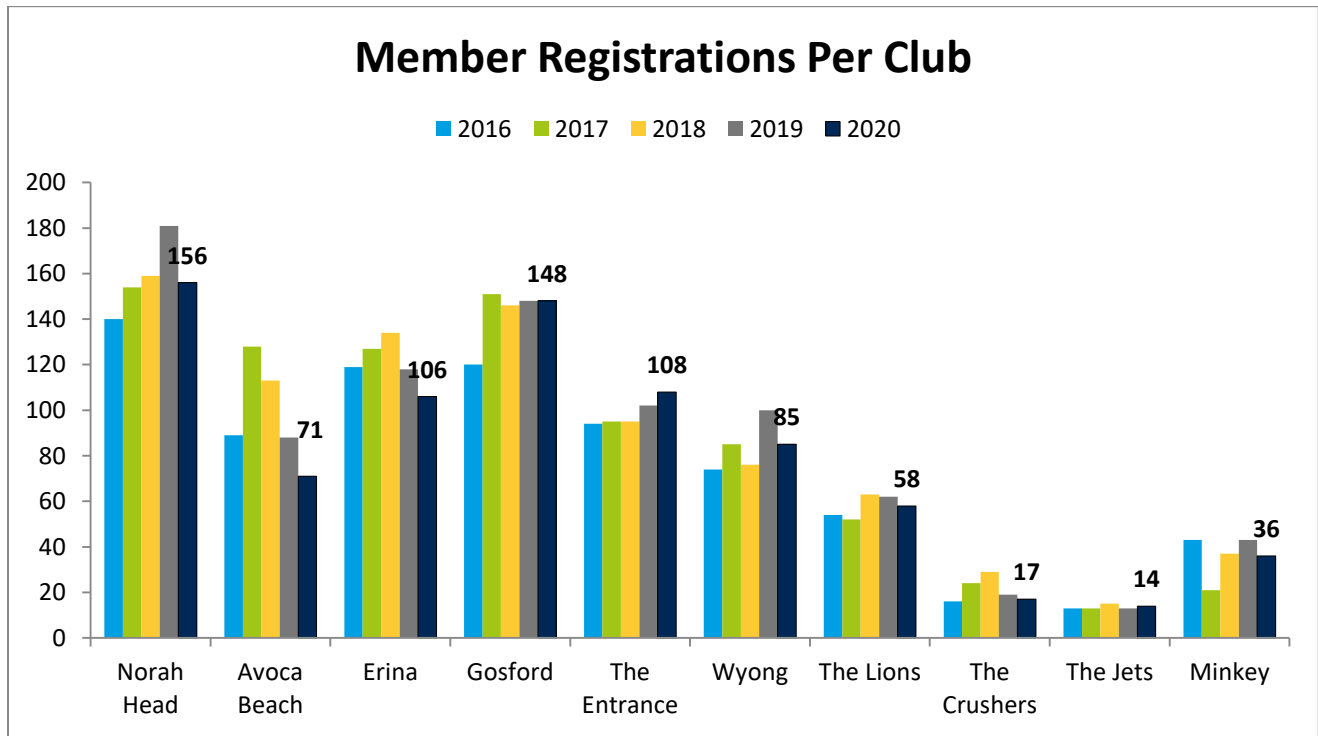

2020 has been a very different year on all accounts, but still another busy year in finance for Central Coast Hockey.

We gratefully received several Grants, in total \$1,418,063.90 for the upgrade of our facilities, this includes a Federal Government Grant for \$550,000 .000 received in the 2019 financial year and deposits received of \$177,737.78 in the 2021 financial year

- \$562,451.12 NSW Department of Planning, Industry & Environment Department of Infrastructure & Transport (+\$140,612.78 received Oct 2020 = total \$703,063.90 inc. GST)
- \$111,375.00 Federal Regional Development and Communications (+\$37,125.00 received October 2020 = total \$148,500.00 inc. GST)

In March, with a majority of registrations paid and ready to go, our worlds were suddenly halted for 4 months. With the guidance of Hockey NSW and the patience of our members, it was invaluable to be able to keep the proceeds of Affiliation fees collected, these were redirected to keep us afloat throughout the shut down. We were then in a position to subsidise competition turf fees & training charges once we returned to the game.

I would like to thank all our Club contacts and treasurers who have prioritised prompt payments at a time when it has been most needed.

We have also, aside from the installation of 2 brand new turfs, been able to continue ongoing improvements & maintenance to our complex, thanks to Mick Tweedie and Laurie Harris for all their work.

Volunteers have continued, yet Honorariums have been reduced to reflect our season. I am continuing to monitor the situation so that our volunteers are appropriately and gratefully remunerated.

Appreciation & thank you also goes out to:

Carol Madden and her small team of helpers for their tireless work in the canteen and Carol's efficiency in ensuring the canteen is stocked and all receipts and bills are delivered to me. The myob capture app and square online reporting has streamlined this process tenfold.

Complex Report

It was as busy start to the year for me taking on Director of Facilities for 2020, working with our Bookings Officer, Grounds Person and getting the canteen into full swing for the start of the year.

The year started as normal with our annual bookings including Woongarra Soccer Club using the grass field for their trials. With the sand field planned to be out of use this season there was going to be disruptions to train and fit games in. The plan was to replace the sand field and then replace the turf on the east field. Then COVID hit right before we even got to start the season. This gave us the opportunity to have both fields upgraded and do some works around the complex.

We started with replacing the turf on the east field. With the Tokyo Olympics postponed we ended up with the turf that was going to be the "Olympic pitch ". We had a lot of ongoing issues with the old east field with countless hours of tradies trying to fix it. The upgrade included a new pump that needed to be installed as the old one was worn out.

To help increase productivity around the complex a new and bigger mower was purchased to reduce mowing time. Laurie our groundsman did a great keeping our complex mowed and looking good even with construction going on. With the sand field demolished earthworks were undertaken and the new pitch including pop up cannons were installed. The new Elaine "Jolly" Johnston Pitch was ready for the finals.

Having both pitches in use for the finals made for a very impressive Grand Final day. Just having games on the Elaine field near the canteen, bar and BBQ made the atmosphere better than we have seen in recent memory. They were flat out all day with many hours spent by Carol organizing the food and drinks. Thank you to the volunteers that helped on the day as you made it the success it was.

Even though the season was short it was full on in the canteen. We saw a lot of night games resulting in the determination that our chip fryer was not big enough. So a new commercial gas fryer with 4 baskets was purchased and installed just in time for the Master's weekend. We have also replaced our old coffee machine with a newer model that uses fresh milk and it seems to be going well.

On the recent Master's weekend, we saw 35 teams from around the state come and use our facilities. It was a very busy weekend with the rain holding off for the first two days, meaning lots of food and drinks were served. The canteen was running 15+ hours a day Friday and Saturday. We could have not coped had it not been for those awesome clubs and volunteers who turned up and Carol's countless hours preparing for our first major event. Happy to say all the feedback I got was good regarding for atmosphere and facilities.

An idea was given to me about creating a new memorial garden for passed members of CCHA and it has since been created. With the new grass hill, it seemed fit to create one as a feature around the edge. Thank you to all that donated plants. We will publish some guidelines shortly for the memorial garden.

In closing a massive thank you needs to go to all club volunteers for Saturday mornings and Grand Final day and for any other times you volunteered. I would personally like to thank Julie, Carol and Laurie for the countless hours spent over 2020. Thank you to Brett Johnson for supervising and overseeing all works on the biggest change to Central Coast hockey.

The complex will continue to change and grow over the rest of 2020 as we look forward to a bigger and better 2021.

2020 saw a very different season for junior hockey on the Central Coast due to Covid-19. With all the interruptions and loss of half the season due to restrictions on sport and our day to day life it was decided that with the easing of restrictions junior hockey on the Central Coast would continue for the remainder of the season on the basis that all age groups would be non-competition to allow all participants to play as many games as possible for the remainder of the usual hockey season. The season proceeded with no reportable incidents which is a testament to those involved with the junior competition at association, club, player and spectator levels and I would like to thank the hockey community for the acceptance and following of new rules implemented to meet state and national health requirements

The 2020 season saw teams from Avoca, Erina, Gosford, Lions, Norah Head, The Entrance and Wyong participate across our 5 age groups along with participants in our Minkey program. Despite the interruptions to the season the team numbers for the season remained on par with 2019 at 36 teams across the age groups as outlined below:

- Minkey – approx. 30 participants
- U9 – 8 teams
- U11 – 8 teams
- U13 – 8 teams
- U15 – 6 teams
- U17/18 – 6 teams

We continued to have increased interest and numbers in our ranks of junior umpires for the U9, U11 and U13 competitions and look to continued development and an increase in numbers for our older age groups as these umpires' transition through in the coming years. I would like to thank Paul Connors for again taking on the role for organising umpires every week across all age groups.

I would like to thank Claire Mercer for the many years she has run the Minkey program and unfortunately had to withdraw (due to Covid) from this position prematurely as this was going to be her final year after many years of running this program following on the legacy of Elaine Johnston. This left a massive hole for the association and junior Minkey program and I am extremely grateful and thanks Rochelle for stepping forward and taking on this role so that we could continue to provide a Minkey program for the 2020 season. This season did not see any minor or major premiers for any age groups for the 2020 season and subsequently did not award any trophies for the following accolades:

- Best and Fairest for each of the age groups
- Volunteer of the year for Junior Hockey
- Junior umpire of the year
- Junior rep team of the year

Thank you to everyone involved in the 2020 season and hope and look forward to the 2021 season returning bigger and better.
