

Club Championship Policy

January 2024

The CCSKC 2024 Club Championship Classes are –

Novice, Rookies, Juniors, KT Modified Light & Heavy, Pro Standard Light & Heavy, Pro125 Open Light.

These are the default classes we will offer Round 1-4, but all classes are subject to numbers attending to continue in the Championship.

(All classes are reviewed annually at our AGM)

Objective:

In order to qualify for Trophies & Awards pertaining to each CCSKC Club Championship Class each year, the following requirements/conditions must be met.

Audience:

All Members of Karting New South Wales.

Requirements/Conditions:

1. Members Only

- a) Only financial CCSKC Members are eligible to compete in the Club Championship.
- b) You must complete one full volunteer day from the roles approved by the Club Committee. That is, Grid Marshal, Scales Marshal, Quad Bike, Water Truck, BBQ/Canteen, Officials roles and other roles as they arise and are approved by the CCSKC Committee.
- c) Club Championship points will accrue from the first Round each year, or from the date of becoming a financial Member. You must then maintain your Membership for the remainder of the Calendar year.
- d) Members who join part way through the year, will only have Round points qualify once they are financial. Any previous points accrued as a non-member will not be included.
- e) Members are eligible to accrue points for multiple classes, as long as all conditions are met.
- f) Memberships which are suspended or cancelled, will forfeit all points accrued by all members covered, in all classes.

2. Calendar

- a) Each years Club Championship calendar dates are normally published by the previous years Presentation date.
- b) Spare dates are published, which may be used in case any Round needs to be re-scheduled.
- c) The Club will not allocate any points, if you cannot compete in any Round, for any reason.

3. Rounds

- a) The Club Championship will be run over a Maximum of 8 Rounds.
- b) Each members Club Championship Class total will be calculated by adding all your Round point scores.
- c) If any Rounds cannot be run, then the Maximum Rounds will reduce accordingly, and point b) will apply on that reduced number.
- d) Each member must compete in 50% or more Rounds, of each Club Championship Class run. Roster duties, Volunteer days or Official Duties do not count towards this total.
- e) Members must ensure they are entered in the correct Class, when Classes are combined or run co-jointly.
- f) Each Round will normally consist of 4 races per Class in total. Due to any Force Majeure event, this may be reduced, but would be done so equally across all classes.
- g) All Round point scores count towards the Highest Point Score end of year Awards.

4. Volunteer Days

- a) Members must ensure they sign the Volunteer/Roster sheets at those Rounds and to whom their days is being done for before racing starts.
- b) If running multiple classes, the Member needs to complete two Volunteer days, or if only doing one day must nominate which class is to be included in the Championship.
- c) Any Volunteer duties approved outside of a race meeting, must be recorded by the Committee.

5. Official Duties

- a) Member Officials that compete in at least 5 Club Championship Rounds and give up their time (as a Clerk of Course or Steward) at up to 2 additional Rounds, will be allocated an average (AVG) point score for those Rounds at the end of the season.
- b) The average (AVG) point score is based on the Rounds previously competed.
- c) If any Rounds cannot be run, then the Minimum 5 Rounds will reduce accordingly.
- d) This will enable Member Officials to be in the running for the Club Championship Class they nominate.

6. Club Championship Table

- a) The member with the lowest point scores each round may be highlighted for award purposes.
- b) Members who perform Official duties, can nominate up to 2 rounds as AVG.
- c) A progressive point score table will be kept and published on the Clubs Speedhive account.

7. Point Score System

- a) The Points awarded for finishing each race is as follows –

1 st	= 50	8 th	= 25	15 th	= 11
2 nd	= 44	9 th	= 23	16 th	= 9
3 rd	= 40	10 th	= 21	17 th	= 7
4 th	= 37	11 th	= 19	18 th	= 5

- b) DNS, DNF, DSQ = 0 points.

8. Trophies and Awards

- a) Each Round, Trophies/Awards will be awarded to the highest 3 point scorers in each Class.
- b) Each Round an Award will be presented to the winner of the Final race in each Class.
- c) Trophies will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places to the end of year Class Champions.
- d) Trophies will also be awarded to the Highest Point Scorers across all Junior (Novice, Rookie, Junior) classes and across all Senior classes.
- e) Other Club speciality Awards will also be reviewed and presented at end of year.
- f) Club members will be eligible to vote on some of these awards.
