

Discussions are advancing on the new club house at Grevillea Park. The Land Development Agency is keen to have us moved from our current site by the end of the year. The overall plan for construction of boating facilities at Grevillea Park is yet to be approved by the National Capital Authority – assuming this goes smoothly, construction is likely in the second half of the year. The LDA is funding the move within a fixed budget – as anyone who has had anything to do with building will know, what you get for a fixed budget gets smaller every time you look at it. We still expect the new facilities will provide scope for growth, less cluttered aisles and, everyone will be delighted to know, showers, toilets and a gym.
