## Round 9 · Report

### A Grade

The *Golden Pen Grippers* have secured a vital contest over *Benfica* to become entrenched in the top four, on Wednesday night in A Grade. With only two rounds to go, the *Pen Grippers* stepped up to put away their ailing opponents in what was a must-win clash. **Pedro Lay** was in scintillating form, winning three singles, while assisting in both crucial doubles victories. Pedro did have to struggle against **Elfrida Kalich**, eventually putting away the veteran, 11-5, 11-7, 7-11, 6-11, 11-6.

In another match, *Void* have returned to the top of the ladder, thanks to a thumping win over *Rainbow 6*. **John Pudney** steered his side home with three singles wins, including a hard-earned victory over **Anhtai Lee**, 11-9, 12-10, 9-11, 7-11, 11-5. **Brodrick On** (*Void*) needed five sets to dispose of the “player of the future,” **Sebastian Lai**, 11-9, 10-12, 14-16, 11-8, 11-6.

Lastly, *CDU* are back in the top four after they won a handy contest against *TAB 2*. **TY Lee** was superb as always in the singles, while **Graham Symons** (*CDU*) held off **TT Lee**, 11-8, 6-11, 11-9, 8-11, 13-11.

### B Grade

*Mojo On* were in top flight after they decimated the *Giants* in a 9-2 romp on Thursday night. A deadly **Kelvin On** was on song, picking up three singles wins in the contest, while teammate **Joseph Juan** overcame **Matt Schobben** (*Giants*) for a second time this season, 11-6, 11-9, 12-14, 10-12, 11-6.

The top side, *Dragonflies*, have secured the minor premiership after they held off a *Jabiroos* challenge. The difference was the *Dragonflies*’ key victories in both the doubles, while a surging **Jordan Lai** fought back to edge the persistent **Arion Magnoli**, 12-14, 11-9, 8-11, 13-11, 11-6. An in-form **Shino Joy** was the best for the *Jabiroos*, winning three singles rubbers.

Powerhouse *Kea* have outclassed *MIC* to finish Round 9 in a one-sided slaughter. The mercurial **Viqar Ali Khan** was at his vintage best in the singles, while his teammate, **Katherine Pinzon**, was also on fire, with both winning three singles rubbers.

### C Grade

*Ring Ins* are back in business after their comprehensive win over the *3 Amigos*. The winning side moved into the top four, thanks to the efforts of **Eric Catalbas** and **Michael Calwell**, winning three singles each. Michael needed five games to earn his third singles win of the night over **Dirk Botha**, 9-11, 11-6, 12-10, 6-11, 11-1.

*Sizzlers* have obliterated the *River Rats* in a one-sided affair. The season is left in the balance for the losers, who will most likely need to win next week to qualify for the semi-finals. Both **Zac Howe** and **John Juan** won three singles, with Zac needing to overcome brother **Joe Howe** in a sizzling contest, 7-11, 13-11, 13-11, 11-13, 11-8.

*Grizzlies* have locked up second place on the ladder after they dismissed *Thunder*. **Jeremie Langlois** won three singles, while **David Allen** won a tough encounter with **Luca Lobo**, 11-9 in the fifth set.

# CHOOSING A BAT

In our first article of a two-part series, *Graham Symons* will have a discussion about choosing a bat to play table tennis. This can be useful information for beginners to any veterans of the sport.

The most important factors in choosing a bat are:

- Your style of play e.g. attacking/defensive/all-round:
  - Defensive players will want a bat which is relatively slow and does not generate much spin – a more “active” bat will react more (spin/speed) to your opponent’s spin and speed;
  - Attacking players can benefit from a bat with more spin and speed – but you need to develop the correct technique to get the benefit;
- Your level of experience and skill level:
  - Generally, the more spin and speed your bat can generate, the less control you have;
  - Whatever the bat you use, improving your technique will give you more shot options and better control.

There are 3 types of bat handles – straight, anatomic and flared. Most players can adapt to use any of these handles, but you might find you prefer a particular type.

## Ready-Made bats

There are several bats you can purchase “ready-made” with blade and rubber between \$40 and \$70. E.G. See Table Tennis World (TTW) and Affordable Table Tennis Warehouse (Afford):

- Tibhar Samsonov \$69.90; Stiga Future \$64.95; & DF Volante \$59.95 at TTW.
- DHS A5002 \$55.95; & Donic Ovtcharov L700 \$39.95.

Any of these bats are likely to be suitable for all-round competition play at C Grade level, with a slight bias towards attacking play.

Next week we’ll look into selecting blade and rubbers separately.
