REPORT

In the contest between two top-three teams, it was *Not Roadies* who cemented their second place on the ladder when they edged *MGJ* in a two-versus-two showdown on Wednesday evening. It all came down to the sole doubles rubber, with **Rodney Hee** and **Martin Feng** clinching the contest, 12-10, 8-11, 11-8. For *MGJ*, **Mitchell Bedford** defeated his opponents, both in five games.

In another match, *Benfica* were completely ambushed as *CDU* surged to a one-sided victory. Both **Renee Li** and **Ramez Mikhail** won three singles rubbers to rule the contest. The latter needed five sets to get past a subpar **Pedro Lay**, 10-12, 21-19, 7-11, 11-7, 13-11. **TT Lee** (*Benfica*) won the only singles rubber for his team, when he defeated the in-form **Sebastian Lai**, 11-9 in the fifth game.

Finally, *Gunners* returned to the top four, when they thrashed the bottom side *Roadies*. Haru Imam bounced back from last week to claim three singles for the first time, including five set wins over **Dennis Evans** and **John Pudney**. **Aakash Patel** (*Gunners*) returned after a lengthy absence to have his best night this season, winning two singles of his own.

REPORT

After an average showing last week, **Maricor Sarceda** stepped up to win three singles, including a 9-11, 11-8, 11-5, 11-9 win over **Richard Lees**. *Roma* sub **Tega** made his debut, winning over **Pingo** to claim his first singles win.

REPORT

UPDATE

As you may be aware, Darwin is hosting a round of the Word Table Tennis Youth Contender series where 83 Juniors will battle for honours including world ranking points – live at Marrara Indoor Stadium on Tuesday 27th to Thursday 29th September. Players will compete in singles events from under 11 years up to under 19 years boys and girls. Matches on Table 1 will be live-streamed through the World Table Tennis website.

We are privileged to host players from Chinese Taipei, Singapore, New Zealand, Sri Lanka, India, and USA as well as a strong Australian contingent. Local Darwin juniors Renee Li and Sebastian Lai are included in the Australian line up.

Prior to the competition, a five-day training camp has also been organised for under 13 to under 17 year olds. The camp is by invitation only, with first priority given to juniors with a world ranking in the top 20. It will be held in the Basketball-side Hall from Wednesday 21st to Friday 25th of September.

This is the only international junior event in Australia open to players outside of Oceania, so it is a great opportunity for locals to watch international standard table tennis.

It has been made possible thanks to a sponsorship from the NT Government, Sports Australia and Darwin City Council, and some hard work from local volunteers. We have imported special Table Tennis flooring and will

be setting up 14 high standard tables including surrounds. The event is also programmed to be held in 2023 and 2024 at the same time of the year and we expect it to grow.

There are a few key roles where we need further volunteer assistance to make this event happen:

- Table and Surround set up Tuesday 20th and Saturday 24th September;
- Bus Driver (light rigid licence only) for transport players from adjacent Airport accommodation;
- Laying the table tennis flooring Saturday 24th September;
- Event admin during the tournament helping take out score cards and similar backup to officials;
- Medal ceremony support at the end of Wednesday 28th and Thursday 29th September.
- Players and officials lounge area manage food and drink stocks during 3 days.
