2024 Junior Hockey Competitions

In 2024, FIAS students will have the opportunity to participate in the Peel Hockey Association's Junior Competitions. Games are played on turf at The Sporting Globe Stadium (Mandurah Hockey Stadium) Fuchsia Place, Halls Head with midweek training held on school grounds or at the turf. All teams are mixed-gender teams.

 - Year 3-4s (play 7-a-side), 9 x players
- J 5-6 Competition Tuesday afternoon/evening games. (Start Tuesday 23rd April 2024)
 School Years 5 to 6 (play full field including goalie) up to 16 players p/team.
- J 7-9 Competition (Junior Years 7-9) Friday night games. (Start Friday 19th April 2024)
- J10-12 Competition (Junior Years 10-12) Monday night games. (Start Monday 22nd April 2024)

Costs – Participation Fees and Levies
