Rules and By Laws: Reviewed February 2020

By Law Number 6

Title: Umpiring Coordinators

Object:

To develop, coach, train and appoint umpires in all grades for all junior and senior (men's and women's) competition games.

Reports to:

The Board of Management via providing a written monthly report. The Chairperson may be directed to attend by the Board President any general or special meeting to deal with matters relating to umpiring.

FNC Umpire Coordinators:

There will be three (3) Umpire Coordinators elected at the Annual General Meeting of any year to manage the umpiring requirements for each season and consider plans and improvements for each following season. The coordinators will be required to provide a written monthly report, including operational matters of the day and progress regarding the KPI's.

Budget Considerations:

The Umpire Coordinators will be able to claim up to \$250.00 each per year (not season) for personal expenses and access a budget of up to \$3,500.00 per season for Umpire Development.

Club Requirement:

Clubs must nominate a minimum of two (2) umpires per team prior to the commencement of the competition. Further each club will be required to nominate their own umpire coordinator whom shall assist the FNCHI coordinators with appointments, replacements, education and training of umpires at all levels.

Frequency of Meetings:

The Umpiring Committee will meet once per month or as required throughout the season to achieve all Key Performance Indicators (KPI's).

Key Performance Indicators:

1. Create each season a register of all available umpires, including name, qualifications and contact details.
2. Grade all umpires as per Hockey ED qualification and / or experience.
3. Conduct a preseason information event/s to outline any rule changes and set out an umpiring pathway plan for the season.
4. Develop and maintain umpiring pathway to improve level and numbers of umpires.
5. Appoint umpires for competition matches and all other matches as required.
6. Promote and coach junior umpires and their development.
7. Supply support and coaching for senior umpires.

8. Identify and nominate umpires for NSW State Championships when required.

Outcome:

To maintain and improve the level and numbers of qualified umpires under the control of Far North Coast Hockey Inc., Umpiring Committee.

Notes:

Hockey Australia runs a Hockey ED program that may be helpful when planning future development.
