PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Realistically the past twelve months have been a little disappointing for the Rams Pee Wee League.

This was mainly due to an inexplicable drop in the number of children playing from 110 in 1983/4 to our initial registration of 75 in 1984/5. The final count for the current season was closer to 90 after some further recruiting after the Christmas break. If further recruiting is done in future I feel it should be done earlier in the season.

PRE-SEASON TRAINING CAMP

The League's first official function for the past season was the pre-season training camp held at the Valley camp near Sandy Creek. 29 children attended this camp which I thought provided a worthwhile start to the season as kids, coaches and cooks all had an enjoyable time and learned a little more about each other and the game.

At this stage it is planned to run our own camp again using the excellent facilities at Parnanga at O'Sullivan's Beach. Information regarding this will be forwarded at a later date.

TEAM SELECTION

On the two Saturday mornings following the camp, coaching clinics were held to show children the basic skills and allow some grading of new players to take place. All training and matches were held at Grange and although the competition was not quite as even as in 1983/4, all children had an enjoyable season. To finish off the season a round robin between 2 groups of 4 teams was played. In an exciting final after a barbeque lunch on 17th March, Playfords Panthers defeated Mainstyle Maulers 5 runs to 3 to win the shield for the first time.

ALL STAR TEAM

A more comprehensive report appears elsewhere but the team acquitted itself well throughout the season especially in the State championship at Weigall Oval when the Rams went down to the Sturt Saints for the second consecutive year 11 runs to 8 in the Grand Final.

This was a top effort by the boys who had to do it the hard way after being beaten convincingly by the Salisbury Jets before winning their way into the final with a marvellous 4-3 win over that side.

My thanks to John Lawrence, Paul Kennett and Mick Gander for their efforts in coaching and managing the team.

UMPIRES

A pool of 5 young lads from the baseball club handled a difficult task quite well. They must be admired for sticking at the job and a belated clinic conducted by the Baseball League umpires Bob and Lyn Jones proved to be of great assistance to them.

My thanks to Tony Duhne, Mathew Graves, Dominic Hodges, Paul McCullough, and Ricky Wilson for a job well done.

COACHES

Once again the majority of coaching staff came from fathers of Pee Wee players. Whilst some people disagree with the concept of people coaching their own children it is difficult to overcome especially in view of the fact that most people wish to see their own children play.

Coaches from the club could be another answer but they are difficult to come by and I am grateful to Gary Chown and Craig Nicholson for coaching teams this year. I think they both have the right approach with the kids and enjoyed their initial coaching experience.

Sincere thanks to Paul Kennett, Jim Goble, Dean Taintey, Kevin Hughes, Neville Talbot, Darryl Jarrett and Ray Pniewski for coaching their respective teams so well.

Paul, Jim and Ray will be following their sons into the club's under 15s next season so vacancies exist in the coaching area for anyone interested. If you feel you haven't quite got the required knowledge, coaching courses will be held later this year to help you.

Hopefully, the club will be able to give more assistance next season, especially in the area of specialist coaching which will help team coaches.

FURTHER DEVELOPMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- (1) More help from the baseball club with coaching
- (2) Conduct of Level 0 and Level 1 course for aspiring coaches or for parents interested in learning more about the game.
- (3) Continuation of Scorers and Umpires clinics.
- (4) More use of the clubrooms on Friday nights - this excellent facility is available to all Pee Wee Leaguers and their parents.

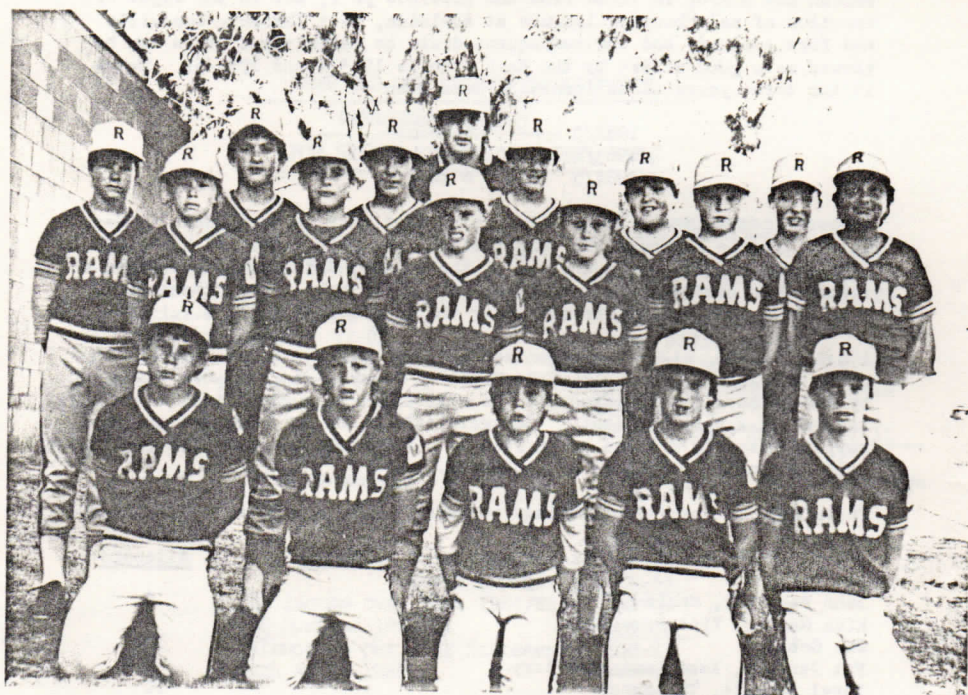

SECRETARY'S REPORT

1984/5, despite first appearances, was a season of consolidation and growth (in realistic terms) for the Rams Fee Wee League. The third season saw a drop in teams from the previous year, but in the light of creation of neighbouring leagues at Adelaide, West Torrens, Woodville and Fort Adelaide and the consequent drain on recruitment, this can be viewed as a good effort by the Rams both in 1983/4 and 1984/5. 


