During any events involving youths, we follow the below procedures.



Child safety

- Changing room allocations (child safety) - youths use main changing rooms, helpers and adult students use the accessible bathroom.
- WWC - make sure any training helpers are parents or have WWC (and is entered in their Rev profile).

Pedestrian safety

- Don't use tractors when students are onsite - tractor operations (eg putting powerboats into the water) must only be conducted when students are away from the operations area. Preferably before they arrive and after they leave.
- Keep the powerboat shed doors closed - once tractor operations have finished, and before students arrive, close all shed doors, to prevent access to tools and plant.
- Cross the car park in groups, with an instructor- don't allow students to run around by themselves
