Principles:

- Pickleball Australia (PAA) is responsible for <u>ALL</u> matters Pickleball in Australia
- Accreditation for Referees is under authority of PAA
- Referees will referee matches in accord with the International Rule Book
- Referees Assessment continues annually
- Rules Examination scores must be maintained at least annually
- PAA will accredit a minimum of two Level 4 Officials Coach/Assessors in each State reporting to the National Head of Officiating (initially)

Demonstrate a propensity to do self-study of key elements before each and every sanctioned tournament at which they are appointed. Generally considered at the "peak of their game."
