

Code of Conduct

FPV Quad Racing WA Inc t/as Rotorcross ("the Association") is a non-profit club with the following objectives:

- To provide a safe, friendly and healing community through event management and activities where people are able to socialise and learn through the sharing of knowledge and experience in the hobby of remotely controlled multirotor craft.
- To promote the safe operation of remotely controlled multirotor craft in public spaces, including the awareness of, and compliance with applicable laws.
- A not-for-profit, non-commercial organisation that is accessible to those who are interested in activities of building, modifying, purchasing, operating and racing competitively of remotely controlled multirotor craft.
- To educate members through advancing skills and to encourage social inclusion, providing a social community of support through its activities.
- To collaborate with like-minded associations, government bodies and businesses in the provision of its objectives
- To advocate for, represent and support the interests of the membership.

Members have a right to:

- 1. Be treated fairly, equally and with respect by the Association, its <u>Committee</u> and other members.
- 2. Socialise in an environment free from all forms of harassment and discrimination.
- 3. Privacy and confidentiality concerning records, documentation and any other communication containing a member's personal information, unless consent is otherwise provided.
- 4. Be informed and actively involved in all club events and offerings.
- 5. Voice their opinions, requirements and suggestions to the nominated <u>Committee</u>.

Members must:

 Treat other members, guests, staff of venues and other patrons (where club functions and facilities are accessed) fairly, equally and with respect and courtesy.

- 2. Behave responsibly and ensure they conduct themselves in a manner which will not injure the reputation of the Association, its strategic partners, its events, organisers, participants or sponsors.
- 3. Not physically or verbally harass others.
- 4. Report any inappropriate behaviour of a member to the <u>Committee</u> of the Association for action and follow up.
- 5. Abide by and uphold the <u>Constitution</u>, the Club Site Rules and this Code of Conduct.
- 6. Pay any fees in relation to an event, or offering (e.g. tickets or memberships) which that member has committed to, regardless of whether the member attends the event or not.
- 7. Notify the Association's <u>Committee</u> of any changes to address or details of the member.
- 8. Not use their <u>membership privileges</u> to purchase tickets to any event or other offering, at a membership price, for non-members of the Association (except for parties entitled to such prices as nominated from time to time).
- 9. If on selling a ticket to an event which the member has booked on to and paid membership rates, if the ticket is sold to a non-member, the non-member price must be paid for by the recipient of the ticket and then the difference on forwarded to the Association.

Breaches of this Code of Conduct:

- 1. Any member not behaving in accordance with the terms of the Code of Conduct at an event of the Association may be asked to leave the function/event and will not be entitled to a refund of any monies paid.
- 2. The inappropriate behaviour of any members will be investigated, discussed and an appropriate course of action will be taken by the Committee, which may include a reprimand, suspension or revocation of membership.
- 3. In appropriate circumstances, the Committee may handle a breach of the Code of Conduct in accordance with the grievance and disciplinary procedures set out in the Association constitution.
