#### RYDE PSSA CODE OF CONDUCT

#### Rationale

Ryde PSSA has agreed on a common Code of Conduct to ensure consistency in expectations and behaviours during competitions run by Ryde PSSA. Consistent expectations and behaviours will increase participant enjoyment and reduce the likelihood of injuries.

#### Values

Ryde PSSA values participation, skill development and enjoyment of sport. PSSA officials and coaches are school teachers, not professional coaches, who do their best to ensure that all students are provided with the opportunity to compete in a fair and respectful competition.

#### **Expectations**

All schools, coaches, students, parents and spectators are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct. The relevant Code of Conduct must be signed by all schools, students, staff and parents of participating students, and returned to the school before they can participate in a PSSA competition.

#### SCHOOL'S CODE OF CONDUCT:



- 13) Behave responsibly while not participating in an organised match and remain in the assigned technical area.

I have read the Code of Conduct carefully with my parents and understand it.

I am aware that:

- A. I may be asked to leave the field of play if I breach this Code of Conduct.
- B. The school may terminate or suspend my participation in PSSA sport if and when a serious breach of this Code of Conduct occurs or if there is a recurrent breach after a warning has been given.
- C. Following a suspension, my coach may elect to select another player.
- D. I may become ineligible to participate in Ryde PSSA Carnivals.

## PARENT AND CAREGIVER'S CODE OF CONDUCT:

#### I agree to:

- 1. Encourage my child to always play by the rules published on the Ryde PSSA website, which are modified to reflect the needs of Ryde PSSA sport.
- 2. Remain on the opposite side of the playing field from the designated technical area.
- 3. Encourage my child to respect and follow the Player Code of Conduct.
- 4. Applaud good performance and efforts by all individuals and teams. When watching a game, congratulate all participants on their performance regardless of the game's outcome.
- 5. Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by refraining from verbal abuse such as foul language and harassing or questioning teachers, players or umpires from my team or another team.
- 6. Encourage my child to work towards skill improvement.
- 7. Never ridicule my child or any other child on the team for making a mistake or losing a game. Positive comments are motivational.
- 8. Not publicly question the officials' judgement or question their honesty.
- Appreciate the contribution and commitment of teachers in coaching positions. They give their time and resources to provide sporting activities for your child and deserve your support.
- 10. Respect the umpires' and coaches' decisions, even if you feel they are incorrect.
- 11. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities. Condemn the use of violence in any form.
- 12. Understand my role is to not coach from the sideline or interrupt the play of the game.
- 13. Keep any pets on leashes or restrained from children. Be aware that some children may have an allergy to dogs or be afraid of them.
