2. Highlights

Our Juniors go International!

A group of enthusiastic Junior U14's who had played and trained together over the last season travelled to Auckland for the Pan Pacific Games in July 2018. See further details in 'Representation' below. Thanks to all the parents, managers and coaches who made this possible – the boys did the Club proud!

New blood in the Board Room!

We were fortunate to have some of our more 'mature' players step up to run the Club over the last year, the current Board consists of Life Members and Patrons with many years of service to the Club who enjoyed support from a new Secretary and Treasurer. We also welcomed the enthusiastic involvement of new Junior parents and are indebted to them for ensuring the Junior Competition ran smoothly and was enjoyed by everyone – thank you to all involved!

Water Polo NSW Intern Program support

This new program was rolled out just prior to the season with Stephanie Evans taking on the official role, ably supported by Lochie Feary bringing her up to speed and contributing to the running both competitions.

Stephanie, with the help of WPNSW Development Manager, Danielle Smith, has put together a comprehensive Operations Manual which will be available on the website for those interested once endorsed by the new Board.

This Manual builds on significant work of previous Board/Committee Members and will be a very useful tool for all those involved in management of our sport moving forward. Danielle also put together a package for our next round of support through a Competition Co-ordinator this will be widely advertised once approved by the new Board.

Think – Act – Play

We concentrated on using the Think-Act-Play (TAP) [Policy](#) over all the competitions and will continue with this in seasons to come. The TAP embodies the core values of sport and our game, respecting the components will ensure that our competitions are played in the best of spirit, fairly and for the benefit of all.

Remember, *"For when the 'one great scorer'* comes to write against your name, he/she writes not that you won or lost, but how you played the game...."* (*your own interpretation of the one great can be used here!).



No talk back Policy

Aligned to TAP, the Club adopted the 'no talk back' policy with referees and play this season. This involved players and officials not talking back to referees during play and for 30 minutes after the game. Official complaints can still be lodged through team captains with the Competition Manager at the desk and all disputes can be resolved away from the playing field and the 'heat' of competition.

Despite a few minor hiccups, this move has positively influenced the standard of refereeing and play throughout our competitions.

We will publish a clear Policy on the website for players and officials to use as a guide in the very near future.

Training/Coaching

Over the season and throughout Winter, we have enjoyed a range of training/coaching and simulated competition mostly at Frensham Pool. Thanks to all involved, especially Jenny, Lauren and Elise Balla. There are details of how you can get involved on the [website](#) and continue to look out for News of developments.

Finances

We thank our Treasurer, Greg Puchert, for taking over the finance reins from long serving Treasurer Ian Feary. Greg has done a great job tracking our finances and keeping expenditure and income under control – thanks Greg!

The Club is in a healthy financial position showing a surplus of \$7,399 for the 2018-19 year which is a very positive result. We are showing a retained surplus of \$40,924 to carry forward. Please note that we have unexpended funds relating to the Clubhouse and replacement of equipment – all will be explained by our Treasurer at the AGM.

Sponsorship and Support

The Club is relatively independent financially and relies on subscriptions to maintain a budget surplus. We regularly reach out through fundraising to bolster funds and support projects.

I would like to acknowledge the ongoing support of Mittagong RSL, BDCU, and this year, Kennards Hire and JCA Engineering who contributed during our return to Mittagong Pool.

3. Pools

As noted above, we returned to Mittagong Pool after Christmas with our U12-14 competitions. Despite our facilities/equipment at Mittagong being destroyed by vandals in a fire in January 2017, the Junior support crew managed to pull off a very successful end to the season at Mittagong.

We are working with Council and various funding bodies to have our Clubhouse (and more) reinstated. Should you wish to get involved or offer your services/expertise, please contact us – we need lots of help, and funds, for this Project!

Frensham Pool has proved to be a real boon to our Club with Senior comps being run there since Mittagong Pool closed. We also tried out this facility for the running of our U16 comp this season which went very well.

The new Board will be discussing competition structure and putting some options to our membership in the near future. Options will involve a range of comps with location at both Mittagong and Frensham Pools – watch this space!

Thanks to management of both Pools over the season for their support and flexibility. We also welcome club player/coach/stalwart Jason Nicholas as the new manager of the Frensham facility and look forward to working with Jason and his staff on training/coaching/playing options.

4. Membership

We have enjoyed a healthy Membership year with a total of 331 Members. To assist with management of our support network and 'Working with Children' requirements, we initiated a new membership class of 'Supporter' for 2018-19. This move resulted in 40 of our local community signing up and provides the opportunity for these members to participate/stay in touch. An added benefit is that our insurance and protection for members also covers the Supporter classification.

Many younger players compete in the Senior comp in both A and B Grade according to age limitations, these players benefit from competition at a higher level, and boost numbers in these competitions – some players manage 3 games a week through this flexibility and their dedication to multiple competitions is much appreciated!

5. Competitions:

In all, 233 matches were played over the season with 1,568 goals scored – that's an average of ~8 per game, a monumental effort! There were also 360 Major Fouls committed over all competitions, that is an average of 1.5 per game.

Below is a summary of Competition for 2018-19, full details can be found under [Fixtures and Results](#) on the Website. Our [Revolutionise](#) website system provides an excellent summary of competition and uses a 'Win-Ratio' formula to best analyse results. Win-Ratio calculates the number of points received, out of the number of points possible, and is the basis for ranking the point scores. It is a fair measure, especially if teams do not play an equal number of games.



Juniors

U12 – Played 12 rounds in total with no finals – there are no points awarded in the U12 competition, as the aim is to develop their skills and game awareness ready for moving to the U14 competition and beyond.

U14 – Played 7 rounds before Christmas, 5 rounds after Christmas, with semi-finals on 19 March and a Grand Final on 26 March. The Oxley Destroyers prevailed over Oxley Missiles in the Grand final with a winning margin of 10-5.

The Junior Committee has provided this summary of the Competition for 2018-19:

Grand Finals

We had great weather for the grand finals and presentation night but typically for the Southern Highlands this time of year it did get chilly once the sun went down.

The U14 grand final was played mate against mate with the Oxley Destroyers and Oxley Missiles facing off. It was a closely fought game with the Destroyers coming out on top 10 goals to 5.

The U16 grand final was also a close game between Oxley White and the Waterburra's. The first half saw only 3 goals scored between both teams and the full-time score was 7 goals to 4 in favour of Oxley White.

Many players from the other teams turned up to cheer on their favourite team and the atmosphere pool side was exciting to say the least. All players and officials should hold their heads high for their determination and enthusiasm, and for playing in the true spirit of the game. Thanks to the referees and scorers for both games.

Presentation

There was a great turnout for the presentation. With the U12s finishing their competition two weeks prior and only four teams playing on grand final night (out of 12 registered for the U14s and U16s) we were unsure how many people would come out for a 6.30pm presentation.

We had the BBQ pumping and had to send out for more supplies! We served approximately 160 sausage sandwiches between 5.30pm – 7pm – a huge thank you goes out to our cooks and servers.

The kids were very impressed with the selection of prizes with many questions about how they could 'get' one of this or that – of course the response was they had to make it to the grand final, nothing like a bit of encouragement to do well next year. We had many enquiries regarding the purchase of a hoodie so we have decided to make these available for junior members to buy.

The U14 and U16 winners each received a SHWP hoodie and the runners up received a SHWP drink bottle. We also handed out awards for the best and fairest for each age group and a coach's award for each team for the most improved player of the season.

A big thank you goes out to the various members of the Junior Water Polo Committee. We all played different roles and had our own strengths and skills which combined together like a well-oiled machine. Also, thanks to the club members who lent a hand setting up and packing up. 8. Coaching

Coaching/training has been on offer consistently over many years at SHWP. Since the opening of Frensham Pool, we have had the opportunity to train all year round in a controlled environment conducive to participation i.e. warm and inviting! 9. Representation

The representative year kicked off with some international competition!

The Honey Badgers Under 14 boys' water polo team are the first Southern Highlands team to contest an overseas tournament, the Pan Pacific tournament in Auckland, New Zealand. There was a big commitment from Coach, Brad Gipson, Manager Alison Oates and Jonathan Hatcher, who as junior competition organiser drove the idea. The dedication of the parent group was brilliant, including raising a lot of cash to fund this project. Along with the Club, here were many local businesses who sponsored the boys, another BIG thank you to these generous supporters!

The boys met some very strong opposition against the Qld Maroons (who finished second in the tournament). They also played the Sea Wolves, a very strong Auckland team that finished high up in the competition, and also the NSW State third team. The Honey Badgers frustrated the top teams, who perhaps underestimated the drive of the Highlands boys.

In their last and most exciting game, the Honey Badgers defeated Waikato, from Hamilton, NZ, 7-6, in sudden death. The teams were locked together, 6-6, at full time. This led to a potential 9 mins of sudden death play. The Honey Badgers had a strategy to go all out at the start of play, to send the ball up to the front and get a shot away. The strategy worked beautifully, and they scored quickly after receiving a penalty in front of the goal.

The boys celebrated like they had won the grand final.

U12 's – Orange 2019



At the end of the season, U12 and U14 players capitalised on the year's competition and training taking part in two competitions:

- 9-11 March with the NSW Junior Country Clubs at Newcastle; and
- 23-24 March, the NWPNSW inaugural U12 Festival at Orange

On the weekend of 23 and 24 March, athletes representing Southern Highlands Water Polo (SHWP) experienced their first taste of the game at representative level. The contingent – comprised of two girls and two boys' teams – travelled to Orange for the inaugural NSWWP Under 12 Festival.

In preparation for the carnival, athletes attended a program of training facilitated by Jenny Balla. This program targeted core skills, basic formations, and game sense.

The girls Purple and Blue teams surpassed all expectations – winning gold and bronze respectively – following a tightly fought battle against themselves!

Despite the quality training afforded to them, the boys teams came face-to-face with competition of new intensity, including four of Sydney's top teams. Score lines were not indicative of the battle waged and both teams earned the respect of their hardened city counterparts. The boys should hold their heads high for their determination, and for playing in the true spirit of the game.

A highlight included the final game of the tournament featuring Highlands Blue and Purple that had supporters for both teams on their feet. Highlands Purple were victorious and it's safe to say competitive spirit is alive and well in the Southern Highlands.

Importantly, all four teams demonstrated monumental improvement across the two days. Coaches of rival clubs noting they were pleased they didn't meet the Highlands boys deeper in the competition citing grit, step change in skill and cohesion.

The fact SHWP registered four teams in the carnival – more than any club at the festival – is testament to the commitment of SHWP to grow the game in our region, and to the best of breed coaching available to our children. The foray into representative level provided invaluable exposure to the ferocity of competition beyond our backyard and instilled our children with a sense of what they should aspire to achieve. Our athletes also connected with new friends from further afield and were fine ambassadors for our region, an equally important aspect of the carnival and game.

The carnival was a fabulous opportunity for our athletes, made possible thanks to the support of SHWP, and to the unwavering passion and commitment of Jenny Balla and Alison Oates. Special thanks also to Lauren and Elise Balla in their coaching and refereeing capacities.

At Newcastle, SHWP did not enter a team, however, players represented in the 'Draft' and gained a wealth of experience!
