

PRESIDENT REPORT

CLUB POSITION

2023 was a year of success for University Juniors both on field and off field. Off field we again set a record for membership numbers with more than 260 joining the club. We also set new heights for player retention this year with more than 15 players hitting the five-year playing mark, we also had a first 15-year player milestone achieved with the last of the inaugural members, Aiden Hellyer being duly recognised at our club presentation day. These milestones were complemented by a return of some of our off-field social activities such as our Hin2H bake sale and the securing of some new club sponsors, in particular Signature Strata, our new main sponsor.

SEASON RESULTS

This good off-field achievement was surpassed however by the performance of our juniors on the pitches. Starting with our youngest stars, the Hin2H cohort, the program was slightly down on recent records but made up for it in enthusiasm and talent. They showed their skills off by dominating the two Hin2H carnivals and I am sure there are a few senior club superstars amongst them.

Our U11 cohort improved dramatically through the year as well and whilst there were no titles in this group, the U11 Div 1 Girls team made a tight game of it in the grand final. From there the results got even better, our U13 Div 1 Girls team atoned for their Grand Final loss in 2022 by doing the minor and major premier double. It was dual success in the U15s, our U15 Div 1 Girls swept all before them doing the double as well, while the U15 Div 2 Boys joined forces with Central to win that competition as the Blizzard team. Coach Ben Ward did a great job initially coaching a team with a really wide spread of skills, then pivoting to the blended team and the politics and challenges that come with that.

Finally in the headline category it was success for both Boys and Girls teams. The Boys swept the comp as well – surviving a scare in the semi before dominating the grand final to take out the Div 1 competition. Our Girls after a tough year last year, had a great year. The girls were initially nominated as a Div 2 team but were promoted by Hockey ACT into Div 1 based on their strength and resilience. That didn't deter the girls who continued to turn up and compete each week with enthusiasm – that is why we treat them as the real U18 Div 2 champs.
